Edward F. Weller Promoted by GM

Appointment of Edward F. Weller, Jr., as head of electronic and instrumentation department of General Motors Research Laboratories has been announced by Arthur F. Underwood, manager of GM Research Laboratories.

Weller, of 1084 Norfolk, Birmingham, succeeds Albert F. Welch, who recently was appointed executive engineer on the General Motors Manufacturing Staff.

In September, 1946, Weller joined GM Research Laboratories Physics Department. After a series of promotions he became assistant department head, supervising research, application, development, construction and maintenance of specialized instrumentation for Research Laboratories and a number of GM manufacturing and production divisions.

He has more than a dozen patents and is author of numerous technical presentations. A pressure indicator he developed aided in early research on high compression engines. More recently his work has included ionization chambers and proportional counters for radioactive isotope applications, ferrites for digital and logic control and solid state semiconductor devices.

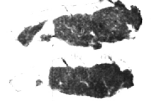

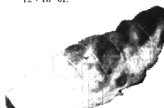
(Left) Boneless prime Sirloin Tip roast of beef; rolled with a thin sheet of suet to preserve juices, neatly shaped for roasting.

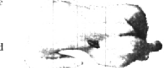
