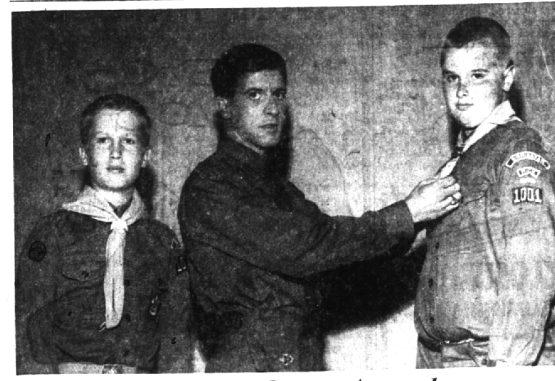

## Rev. Falk Discusses 'Visions and Dreams'

"Visions and Dreams," a lecture-themed sermon, was delivered by the Reverend Robert F. Falk at the 9:30 and 11 A.M. services June 17. This was his farewell message to the congregation of Birmingham's First Methodist Church.

Also on this day, the Detroit Annual Conference concluded its four-day meeting at Adrian, Michigan; after which Methodist ministers were re-elected and appointed to new positions. Rev. Falk's message was especially geared to the youth of the church, with whom he has worked since October, 1958.

THE REVEREND Falk will conclude his assignment as Minister of Youth this Sunday. He leaves the local church staff to join the faculty of Mt. Union College, a Methodist-related liberal arts college in Alliance, Ohio.

Rev. Falk came from New York to Birmingham in 1958 with work experience that included ministries in three Methodist parishes in New York and Massachusetts. He received his theological training at Drew Seminary where he graduated in 1957, with a Bachelor of Divinity, cum laude.

LOCALLY, Rev. Falk worked with former Director of Christian Development Miss Virginia Sager to develop a complete youth program; bringing youngsters of all ages into active participation in church and community affairs.
