Summer is just beginning—officially. The season's official beginning comes at 12:24 p.m. today according to University of Michigan astronomer Hazel M. Losh.

"On this day Michigan will receive the most heat from the sun for any 24-hour period of the year, because the sun will reach its most direct position over the northern half of the earth," she explains.
