

# Pros Teach Little Leaguers in Film

Big league tips for "Little Leaguers" is the theme of a new 30-minute color movie now available for free showings from dealers handling Plymouth, Dodge, Chrysler and Imperial passenger cars and Dodge trucks.

The film features Frank Lary, Jim Bunning, Don Mossal, Norm Cash, Al Kaline, Rocky Colavito, Bill Bruton, Steve Boros, Chico Fernandez, Jake Wood and Dick Brown as instructors. The movie was shot at Lakeland, Fla., spring training camp of the Detroit Tigers, this spring.

George Kell, former American League batting champion and all-star third baseman, narrates the film.

PETER J. McGovern, president of the Little League organization, and Bob Scheffing, Detroit manager, introduce the action. The new film is part of a continuing Chrysler Corporation program in cooperation with Little League baseball. R. E. Forbes, director of advertising for Chrysler, said:

Lary, Bunning and Mossal display their pitching wares through the eye of the slow motion camera to emphasize control. Tips in grip, delivery and position are demonstrated by each hurler.

Cash, 1961 American League batting champ, performs double duties in the film. He shows how to play first base as well as providing tips on hitting.

KALINE and Colavito aid Cash in the batting instruction. All three point out the importance of a level swing.

Infield play is demonstrated by Boros, Fernandez and Wood. Training designed to help young throwers from a variety of positions is emphasized.

The slow motion camera is used

to allow closer study. All three infielders stressed the importance of being balanced to field the ball both to the right and left and to throw to a base.

Outfielder Bruton instructs youngsters on the fundamentals of outfield play. How to catch fly balls, line drives, shoestring catches; balls hit to the right, left, in front and in back are all covered. The importance of being ready to move in any direction is as important to an outfielder as to an infielder, stresses Bruton.

BROWN demonstrates the duties of a catcher. He shows how to provide a steady target for the pitcher, how to back up first base on infield hits, how to field bunts and how to catch pop flies, including the proper way to discard a catcher's mask.

For two previous years, the auto firm has distributed "A Happy Summer Evening," a film about the growth of Little League baseball. More than eight million people have seen the previous film.

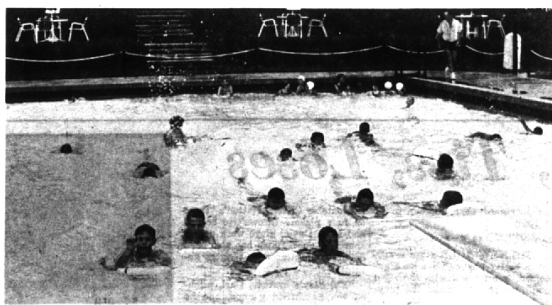
