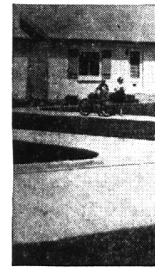
SCHOLARSHIPS

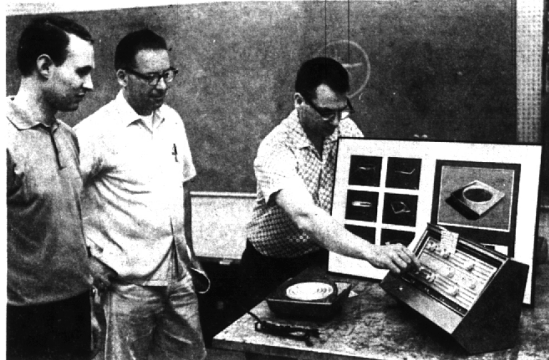

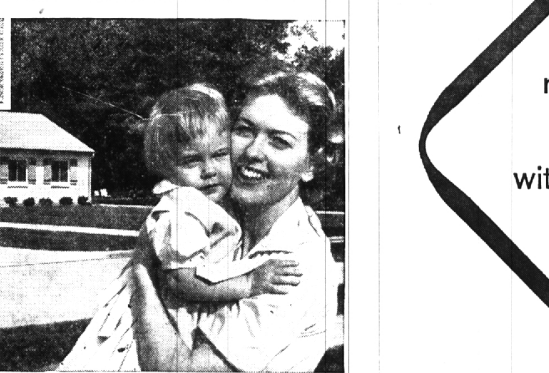
Faculty members look over student entries from the Industrial Design department for the 26th annual Wayne State University art exhibit recently. (From left),
