

State Police Warn Holiday Motorists

With travel heading toward peak summer volume in Michigan, the State Police are urging motorists to drive with extra care, especially during the July Fourth period when highways will be additionally taxed by holiday traffic.

As a warning for greater attention to safe driving rules, Commissioner A. C. Childs emphasizes that accidents and injuries are respectively running about 22 and 14 per cent above their 1961 rates, despite a reduction in deaths so far this year.

"I can't add much more to that than to say that the driver who wants safety can have it by following those simple rules," he said. "There's nothing complicated about it, just attention to the serious job of driving."

THE STATE Police, assisted by 100 members of the National Guard, will be on holiday patrol from noon Tuesday, July 3, to midnight Wednesday, July 4. Guardsmen will serve as second men on two-man patrols or on point contact. State Police detectives as needed will reinforce uniform officers as desk assignments.

Maximum patrol coverage will be from 3 to 9 p.m. Tuesday and Wednesday when holiday traffic is expected to be heaviest.

Because traffic patterns may differ somewhat this July Fourth from the usual holiday concentrations due to the 20-hour midweek observance, State Police patrols have been alerted to also devote special attention to the weekends before and after when traffic problems may be just as acute.

Wood Moldings Solve Tricky Decor Problems

Difficult decorating problems often can be licked by the discreet use of wood moldings, designer Carl Ficken advises his clients.

Ficken, a member of the American Institute of Decorators and the National Society of Interior Designers, points out that a room that's too long will appear to have better proportions if wood moldings are applied vertically to the side walls at regular intervals. The panels can be painted to match or contrast with the walls or can be left the natural wood color.

"To GIVE A pleasant life to a long, narrow hall, break up one wall with panels of two different colors separated by vertical moldings," Ficken suggests. "Leave the opposite wall unpaneled and paint it just one color."

Stock moldings of ponderosa pine are available in many sizes and styles to help the decorator, whether amateur or professional, improve the appearance of a room at low cost.

The designer explains that when it's not practical to make structural changes in a house or apartment, moldings can work wonders.

HERE ARE SOME additional tips he gives for decorating with stock molding:

Flush doors, plain cabinets, and unfinished furniture: Add strips of molding to give the popular provincial look.

Windows and doorways: Emphasize and add architectural importance by framing with molding.

HIGH-CEILINGED rooms: Attach a horizontal strip of molding to walls two or three feet above floor, using contrasting paint or paper below to make a dado.

Fireplaces: Make a panel of molding above the fireplace and hang a picture within it to give traditional elegance to the focal point of the room.

For unusual effects, combine various styles of moldings.

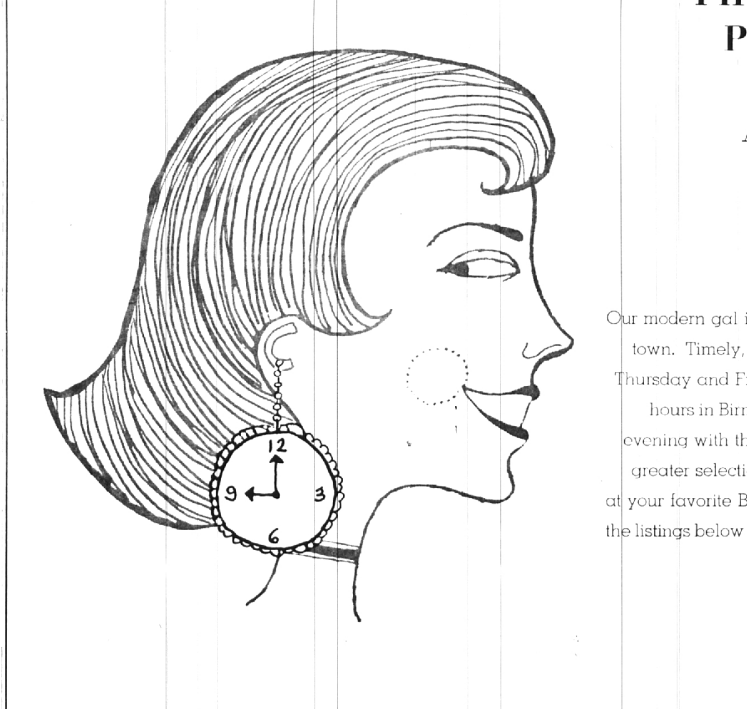
