## Arthritic Hands

*Q. I have arthritis in my hands. Is there any way to prevent severe crippling of the fingers?*

A. There are measures which help prevent severe deformity. Doctors usually encourage mild exercise of the fingers and wrist, especially after application of heat. A whirlpool-type bath is good and may be provided in the home by running hot water from a faucet into a partially filled sink or pan. Finger exercises should be done several times throughout the day. Forceful "stretching" of the fingers is not helpful and may do much harm. In addition to physical measures, there are medical and surgical ways of helping the "arthritic hand," so consult your physician.

*Q. What is a polyp on the vocal cord? What causes it?*

A. A polyp is a small growth or nodule found especially on mucous membranes. The common name for a polyp on the vocal cords is "singer's nodule." What causes these growths is unknown.

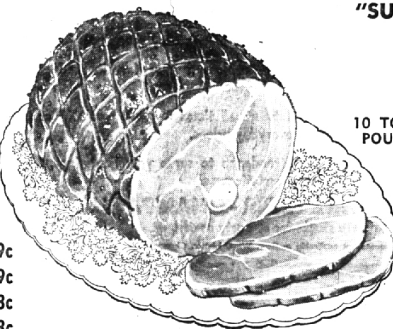
