Pointing out that Michigan water accidents on a recent June weekend claimed 17 lives, the State Police are uring swimmers during the July Fourth holiday and at other summer outings to use only supervised, authoried areas where there is provision for rescue in event of

trouble.
Reports received by the State Police up to June 21 show that 110 water accidents have taken 66 lives and injured 4d other persons. Twenty-nine of the victims, or almost half the deaths, were swimmers. The provisional toll is eight, or about 14 per cent more than 58 as of June 23 last year.

THE BREAKDOWN of the 66 deaths includes 29 swimmers, 15 who fell from bridges, banks, docks and piers, eight boat operators, six who fell through ice, four boat passengers, two who drowned in rescue attempts, one ski or scuba diver, and one who fell into an uncovered tank.
