Swimming Safety Stressed

Pointing out that Michigan water accidents on a recent June weekend claimed 17 lives, the State Police are urging swimmers during the July Fourth holiday and at other summer outings to use only supervised, authorized areas where there is provision for rescue in event of trouble.

Reports received by the State Police up to June 21 show that 110 water accidents have taken 66 lives and injured 44 other persons. Twenty-nine of the victims, or almost half the deaths, were swimmers. The provisional toll is eight, or about 84 per cent more than 58 as of June 23 last year.

THE BREAKDOWN of the 66 deaths includes 29 swimmers, 15 who fell from bridges, banks, docks and piers, eight boat operators, six who fell through ice, four boat passengers, two who drowned in rescue attempts, one ski or scuba diver, and one who fell into an uncovered tank.

With gravel or excavation pits accounting for nearly 20 of the drownings, the State Police warn against swimming in such waters for these reasons:

Many swimmers are inexperienced, general lack of safety devices and adult supervision; and the unfamiliar waters may have sudden currents to swimmers and divers.

EML League Split in Half

Following a proposal by four of its eight members Saturday, the Eastern Michigan League board of directors voted to divide the league into Eastern and Western sections. The four schools making the proposal all belong to the Western Division, including Seaholm High School.

In a formal announcement issued by John W. Diekey, principal of Hazel Park High and secretary of the EML, the league said "the principals and athletic directors of the Eastern Michigan League by a unanimous vote . . . decided to form the nucleus of two leagues."

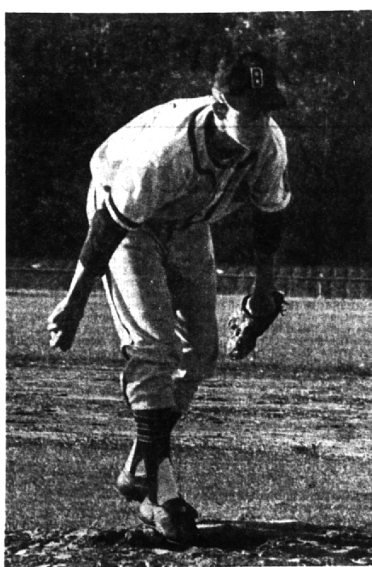
SEAHOLM, Ferndale, Hazel Park and Royal Oak Kimball are in the Western Division. The Eastern is composed of East Detroit, Mount Clemens, Port Huron and Roseville. The EML will remain in its present structure until July 4, 1964. Formed in 1948, the league originally had five schools as charter members: Birmingham, Ferndale, Hazel Park, Mount Clemens and Port Huron. East Detroit joined the league in 1945, Kimball in 1957 and Roseville in 1961.

Saturday June 30, 1962, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.
Monday July 2, 1962 from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m.
Saturday July 7, 1962 from 10 a.m. to 12 noon.

and on the LAST DAY, Monday, July 9, 1962, from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

TO TRANSFER a registration from one address to another WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF BLOOMFIELD, send a signed request to the office of the Township Clerk, stating present address, former address, and date of moving to present address. Such transfer may be made any time up to and including July 9, 1962, at 8:00 o'clock p.m.

Those persons who have already registered under the permanent registration system and have voted within the last four years do not have to re-register.
