Horticultural Therapist To Speak at Symposium

Alice W. Burlingame, garden consultant and horticultural therapist of Birmingham, will be a featured speaker at the 16th annual Williamsburg Garden Symposium. To be held from March 18-23, the Symposium is a five-day spring preview featuring educational and social activities in Virginia's restored colonial capital.

Mrs. Burlingame will speak on March 20, on "Gardening as a Therapy." Her illustrated talk will be held on the road.

MRS. BURLINGAME'S programs in horticultural therapy at hospitals, prisons and mental institutions were the result of her combined studies in sociological and horticultural subjects at the University of Michigan and at Michigan State University. These two universities have jointly presented her with a Citation of Merit for her work. She has also been made an Honorary Fellow of the American Scandinavian Foundation.

With Dr. Donald P. Watson of the Michigan State faculty, Mrs. Burlingame co-authored a book entitled "Therapy Through Horticulture." The garden consultant is the wife of William H. Burlingame.
