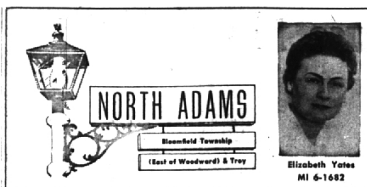
Phil Hart Dinner Committee Named

Nasal Stuffiness Not Sinus Trouble

Q. I must have sinus trouble because one or the other side of my nose is always stopped up. Would nose drops help?

A. Alternating stuffiness or obstruction of the two sides of the nose could hardly be considered "sinus trouble." In fact, alternating nasal obstruction is normal. The scroll-shaped masses of nasal tissue (turbinates) on one side are commonly more congested than the turbinates of the other and this allows a greater amount of air to go through the more open side. From time to time, perhaps every 15 minutes to two or three hours, the turbinates on the congested side become smaller and the nasal passage opens up, while at the same time the turbinates on the other side become congested and more or less close up the passageway. Nose drops are only rarely helpful and may even perpetuate nasal obstruction. It is certainly not wise to habitually use nose drops.
