CRANBROOK—"What's New in Archaeology?" will be explained by Dr. Froelich Rainey when he lectures on March 1 at 8:15 p.m. in Cranbrook School auditorium, sponsored by Cranbrook Institute of Science.

Dr. Rainey is director of the University Museum of Philadelphia and president of the American Association of Museums.

His personal archeological investigations have ranged from Alaska to Guatemala and the Valley of the Nile. In recent years he has been testing new methods of archeological explorations in Italy and Nubia.

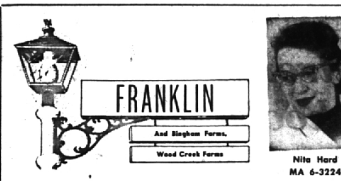

Broadcasting Co. To Use Saarnen's Skyscraper Design

The only skyscraper design ever made by late Birmingham architect Eero Saarnen will be used in the construction of a 38-story building by the Columbia Broadcasting System.

The building will be erected a block north of Rockefeller Center in New York. It is scheduled for completion in 1964.

The plans were completed by Saarnen before his death Sept. 1. He considered it "the simplest skyscraper statement in New York."

Of reinforced concrete with a facade of dark granite, it will be surrounded by a granite plaza, slightly below street level. The building will house six of the seven operating divisions of the network.

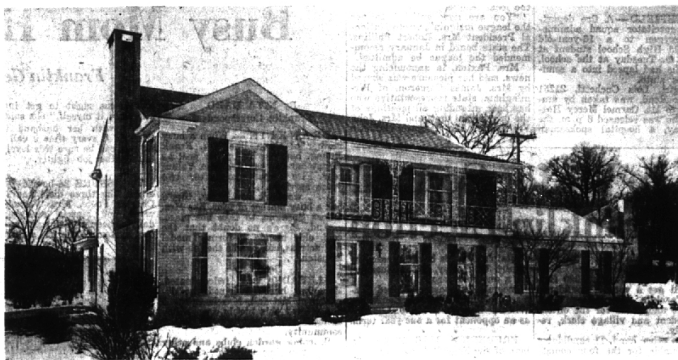
