### Women Voters Sponsor Panel Meeting on Trade

The issues involved in tariff and trade will be explored March 19 when a four-man panel discusses "Trade Patterns for the Sixties" at a meeting sponsored by the Birmingham League of Women Voters. A reception at 8 p.m. will be followed by the discussion at 8:30 in the Birmingham Community House. Panel members will be Mal Evans, assistant director of United Automobile Workers education department; James Fletcher, public relations department, Chrysler Corp.; Howard V. Clark, executive vice president, Detroit Steel Corp.; and Dr. Lewis E. Lloyd, economist, Dow Chemical Co. Mrs. Walter Jackson will act as moderator. She is institute coordinator of continuing education at Michigan State University Oakland.

MRS. LEE SPANIER, local LWV foreign policy chairman who is in charge of arrangements for the forum, said a number of housewives and civic leaders are expected to attend the event, among them Mrs. Ruth Shank and Mrs. Pauline E. Lloyd. Two local schools have evidenced interest in the trade and tariff picture, Mrs. Spanier said.

### Sidewalk Raiser Floods Basement

"It was just one of those days," said Birmingham DPW Supt. Tom Brien. Brien said the DPW was setting a main down in front of the Peacock Room on N. Woodward Saturday afternoon. "We got to an old hydrant lead pipe and plugged it," he said. "Then that blew off and blew water in under the sidewalk and raised a portion of it up about two inches." The mishap also flooded the basement of the shoe store which was with about one to two inches of water, the DPW official said.

### Break Ground For 12-Town County Drain

Officials of 14 municipalities participated Saturday in groundbreaking ceremonies for the 12-Town Drain in South Oakland County. County Drain Commissioner Daniel W. Barry wielded the spade at the corner of 12 Mile Road and Stephenson Highway, Madison Heights, as mayors and council members of the various communities watched the ceremony.

The storm-relief drain, costing about \$40 million, will serve a 37-square-mile area in the southern part of the county. The drain will be largest single public works project of its kind in the state. At present, drainage in this area is dependent on a network of drains dating back to the 1820's. The entire project is scheduled for completion in early December, 1963. Twenty-two contracts have been let for its construction.

GRIGGS HAD BEEN awarded \$12,000 against the county by a board of viewers formed under Pennsylvania law. However, this was set aside by the Pennsylvania Supreme Court which ruled there had been an unconstitutional taking of the airplane above Griggs' property by the county. The state court recommended that Griggs pursue litigation against owners or operators of aircraft, and Griggs applied to the U. S. Supreme Court for compensation from the county.

engineering, purchasing and industrial relations. It will also handle general coordination and manufacture of Ford tractor operations in both countries.

MR. HILL, 965 Glengarry Circle East, resigned Friday after 32 years in the automotive and farm implement field. His resignation was accepted with regret by the company, said Henry Ford II, chairman of the board, who made the announcement. The executive, who will be 60 this August, said in his resignation that he wished to devote more time to personal interests and other business activities.

He joined Ford with the establishment of its tractor division in August, 1953. During the next eight years, he progressed from assistant general manager to general manager and finally became a Ford vice president in May, 1959.

A NATIVE OF Pontiac and a University of Detroit graduate, he has been associated with General Motors Corp., Dearborn Motors Corp. and Harry Ferguson, Inc., in the course of his business career. He is president of the Detroit Area Council, Boy Scouts of America; a trustee of the Michigan 4-H Foundation and a member of the board of directors of the National 4-H Service Committee. Locally, he is a member of the executive committee of the Oakland Child Guidance Clinic, Inc. and chairman of the finance committee of the Republican Committee of Oakland County. He is also a director of the Birmingham-Bloomfield Bank.

In addition to chairmanship of the agricultural committee of the Greater Detroit Board of Commerce, he is a member of the agriculture department of the U.S. Chamber of Commerce.

MR. HAMPCON WAS elected a Ford vice president in April, 1961, a month after he was appointed general manager of the former Ford Tractor Operations. Mr. Dearborn, general sales manager of the Tractor and Implement Division since 1958, joined the division in 1955 and became manager of its Detroit regional sales office a year later.

Mr. Dearborn's appointment as general sales manager, he served as assistant general sales manager in charge of regional operations.
