

Beverly's Tax Picture Complex

BEVERLY HILLS—What do taxes amount to in the village of Beverly Hills?

It's a rough question to answer. Beverly Hills is a growing community of the state of

THE STARTING point for figuring this out, of course, is to look at the home assessment.

As an example, if an indivi-

dual purchases a \$27,000 home in Beverly Hills, the house would be evaluated by the village assessor at about one-third of its market value or \$9,000. So, to the village the owner of this house would have the responsibility of paying nine times the tax rate—specifically, for 1961; \$3.89 per \$1,000 or a total of \$35.01.

WHAT ELSE do villagers have to pay. I the house is located general to the house is located general Evergreen where severs exist, the home owner has or will have to pay a \$400 sum for the right to tap into the Evergreen interceptor sewer system.

HOME OWNERS west of Evergreen to the village limits between 12½ and 14 Mile must pay the cost of having the major sewer lines built in their

major sewer lines built in their area.

The bigger the lot the more the sewer and, naturally, the higher the bill. The average cost to village residents is between \$700 and \$800—more or less, depending on the amount of land. Some persons who have iess, depending on the amount of land. Some persons who have a great deal of land are paying several thousand dollars for the project.

The area has no existing sewer. The whole system is being installed from scratch.
