S'field Rd. Widening Talks Set

LATHRUP — A meeting with Oakland County Road Commissioners and members of the city council may be set for Monday evening.

Council members plan to discuss the county's revised footing drain policy and local water works improvement, following the review of road matter.

A PRELIMINARY construction agreement on the road widening part of a county plan involving area communities, led to several questions on the part of councilmen.

They indicated they would like clarification of obligations Lathrup might assume if the city takes jurisdiction of 11 Mile Road within Lathrup.

RECONSTRUCTION costs for 11 Mile Road have already been estimated at about \$75,000.

City Attorney Everett Hayes told council that he and county commissioners had approached the agreement as a preliminary one that would involve negotiation.

AT THE STUDY meeting, council members will review a county DPW proposal to change present county regulations to allow footing tie connections with the city's sanitary sewer systems.

Twelve communities would be allowed such connection to eliminate the need for sump pumps in new home construction.

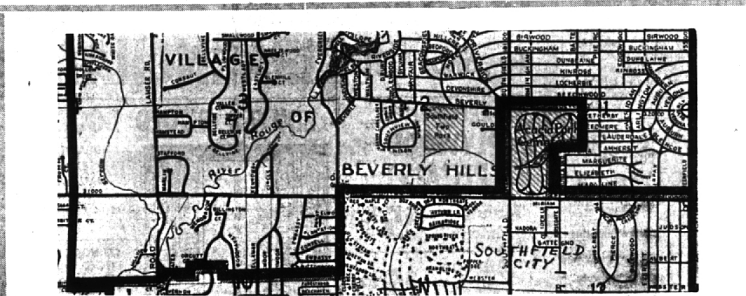
