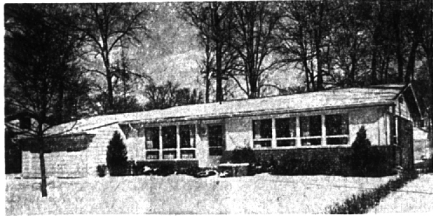


Surf Club Okayed For B'field Township

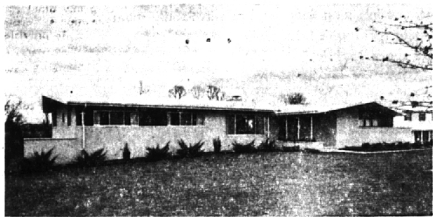

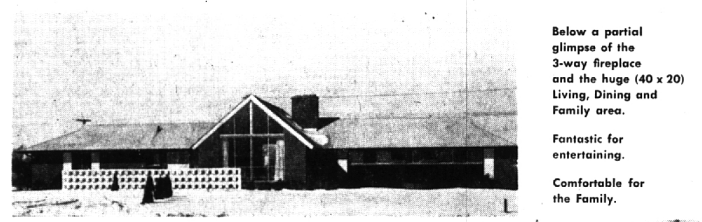

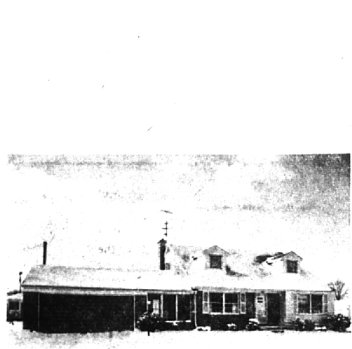
