Seeking the vacation are Erb, Restrick Lumber Co., Restrick and Co., and Lumber Panel Components, Inc.

In a motion read to the commission Monday night, Assistant City Manager R. S. Kenning recommended that the petition be denied for reasons of fire protection.

Commissioners directed Kenning to confer with the petitioners' legal representative and the city attorney in an attempt to negotiate a solution.
