## ALTERNATIVES

If perennials were not mulched after the ground froze several inches deep in the fall of '61 the alternative is to DO IT NOW.  
Use 6" to 10" of MARSH HAY. Do not pack it down—as the plants need air but not full sun. The reason for this is that alternate thawing and freezing of the ground is one of the major causes of dead plants.  
DON'T REMOVE MULCH on the first warm day in March. More about this later.  
NOTE:—Spring flowering bulbs will think you are just peachy if you cover them right now!

The INDOOR MINIATURE ROSE BUSH is a happy alternative for the regular rose bushes at this time. It grows easily and equally well indoors or outdoors and is normal in its requirements. Pink or red. \$1.39 each.  
A lovely idea for a simple and enduring Easter greeting.

As an alternate to the Easter Egg, which is an overdone sort of hard-boiled affair, there is the exciting—  
HATCH-A-COLEUS  
For 89¢ we give you the seeds, the growing medium and the greenhouse (which, of course, is shaped like a hard boiled egg.)

All you have to do is open it, add 9 tablespoons of water (not heaping), sprinkle on the seeds, press them in and replace the cover.  
If you don't want to go to the trouble of doing this hard labor and assuming the expense of the water, remember—THIS CUTE THING IS ANOTHER INTERESTING IDEA FOR AN EASTER GREETING.

An alternative to the alternate for the Easter Egg is the real sharp  
HATCH-A-CACTUS  
It, too, has that real Easter Egg shape—but, no yolk. They really grow! 59¢ & 89¢ the shell—no yolk.

BOREDOM is the current condition (excuse us, ma'm) for those vital men who can hardly wait to get out in the yard, chop through the ice and start working up the beds.

As a useful alternative to him we suggest that you start planning the PRUNING PROGRAM—some of which you can do and much of which HIM can do.  
1. Get your cutting tools in "sharp." We will pick them up and deliver them back. (This part is FREE). The conditioning charges amaze us because of their normalcy.  
2. Simple pruning involves getting rid of those branches which are diseased, obstructive (in the wrong direction), rubbing against each other, dead wood and weak & worn out crowded items.  
3. Within the next 2 or 3 weeks we will give more detail in this column. The results of unintelligent pruning are almost worse than no pruning at all. It's sort of like cutting your man down to size without a full realization of what he will be like when you get him there. Perish the thought!
