## Con Con Report

Win Fight to Check Agencies

Spokesmen of both parties differed entirely in their analysis of the effect of the provision. Judge Paul V. Gadola (R-Flint), explained that appeals generally are now limited to questions of law.

"If a court finds a scintilla (just a speck) of evidence, then it has to uphold the agency's decision. When a man can look at his livelihood, there ought to be more evidence than a speck; it ought at least be the reliable and substantial," he said.

DEMOCRATS introduced a series of amendments, including one to delete the word "reliable." Robert C. Hodges (D-Detroit), charged this word would throw the burden of proving its evidence "reliable" onto the agency.

"There is no way a judge reading evidence can tell if it is reliable," he said. "This will throw an awful load on the agencies."

Hodges said Democrats were not content with the decision of the agency said to be the chief target of the provision—the Liquor Control Commission.

"Our main concern is with the Employment and Unemployment groups," he added. "Their work will be in jeopardy from capricious agencies. An injured workman needs money and if his case is tied up on an appeal he can't get it. These cases take a year or two and in the end the claimant has to pay 20 or 25 lawyer."

## Mother of Two Charged With YMCA Thefts

Mrs. Marlon E. Danner, a Bloomfield Township mother of two, will appear in Municipal Court, Birmingham, next Friday on a charge that she embezzled funds from the Birmingham branch of the YMCA.

Mrs. Danner, 54, of 6385 Sherrington, was released on \$500 bond. Lt. Merlin Holquist of the Birmingham police said the charges were brought by Harry B. Sanders, executive secretary of the Detroit YMCA.

Police said more than \$5,000 is involved but the formal charge reads for embezzlement of an amount over \$100. YMCA officials said an audit report is still in progress.

An employee at the Birmingham branch for five years, Mrs. Danner, allegedly obtained the money by cashing dues and rent checks and only forwarding a part of the money to the Detroit Y headquarters.

Holquist pointed out that the woman was a bonded employe and the money was insured.
