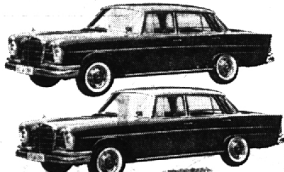

Proxy Statement Reveals Salary Of L. L. Colbert

The salary of L. L. (Tex) Colbert of the board of Chrysler Corp. of Canada was revealed Monday at \$4,168 a month.

The former chairman and president of Chrysler received this salary after giving up his \$250,000 a year position with the parent company in July of last year.

COLBERT'S pay was revealed with the release of the corporation's proxy statement for the April 17 annual meeting in Detroit. Colbert received \$167,317 for his seven months' service in his former position, topping the yearly salary received by his successor, Lynn A. Townsend of Birmingham.

TOWNSEND'S salary for the year was \$118,400 representing a \$45,000 increase over his previous salary. Townsend was formerly administrative vice president of the company.

The corporation declined comment on the annual Townsend pay have received when he became president.

GP Farms Favors Income Tax Plan Study

A different kind of income tax resolution was presented to the Birmingham City Commission this week.

Last year, the commission adopted a resolution stating opposition to an income tax that might be levied against Birmingham residents.

SINCE THEN, the commission has received resolutions from several other municipalities opposing any kind of an income tax by another community that would be levied against their own residents.

This week, the commission received a resolution from Grosse Pointe Farms City Council expressing its "willingness and desire to join with the City of Detroit and any other interested communities in undertaking an objective study of the recent income tax proposals submitted by Detroit to the State Legislature to the end that the program will insofar as possible be bilateral in nature and will not be based on unilateral action."

REFERENCE is made to the proposal to establish a Detroit-Wayne County-suburb combined income tax.

OK Negotiation In Effort to Sell Oakdale Property

Having failed to receive any bids on its offer to sell the vacated southern portion of Oakdale Ave., the Birmingham City Commission has decided to negotiate for sale of the property.

Commissioners Monday night authorized the manager's office to negotiate with the only property owner who has shown any interest in the property, which has been owned by the late Carl O. Barton, Brewer and developer of the shopping center on Maple east of Hunter.

THE CITY-owned Oakdale property was advertised for sale with a minimum bid of \$17,000 to be accepted. No bids were received. Commissioner William E. Roberts suggested that rather than let the property lie idle, effort be made to sell it through negotiation. Commissioner Ralph A. Main suggested that a lease arrangement might be possible.

Oppose Taxing Parking Lots

Birmingham city commissioners registered opposition Monday night to a proposed state senate bill that would tax parking lots.

They directed that personal contacts be made with the area's two state legislators, Rep. Henry M. Hogan Jr. and Sen. Farrell Roberts, and that telegrams be sent them stating the City's opposition.

Commissioners contended that Senate Bill No. 1158 would cost the City an estimated \$10,500 a year for operation of its municipal parking lots. The bill calls for leasing of lots and a specific tax of 10 per cent parking space.

Private operators of parking lots would also be taxed.
