Discussion Postponed On Higher Golf Rates

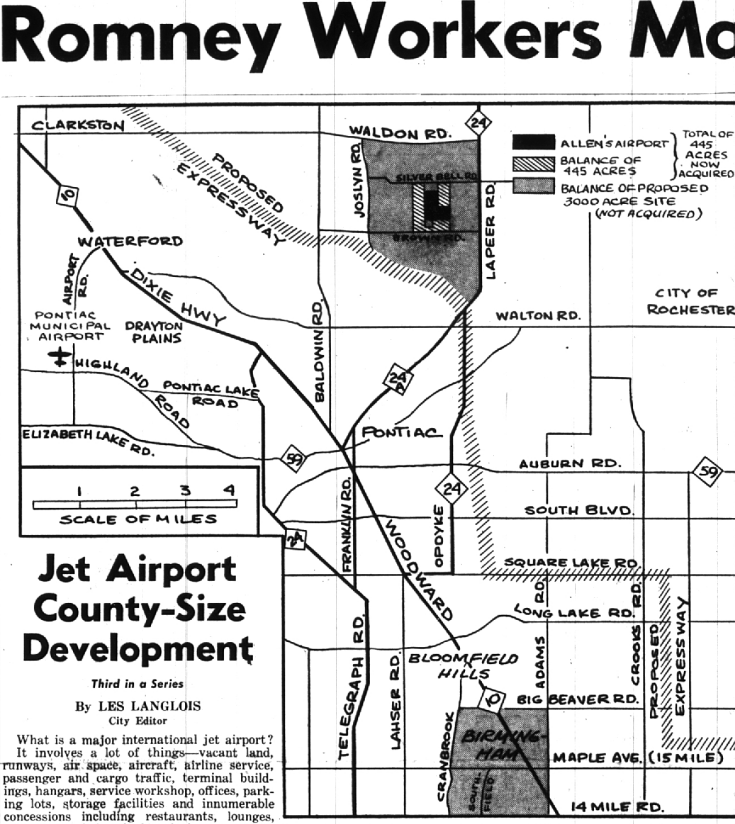
Due to the absence of two of their colleagues, Birmingham city commissioners Monday night postponed discussion of proposals to raise the rates at Springdale Golf Course.
