place along the Atlantic coast?" he replied. "Sure!" Then I asked him: "Just where in the east do you expect to finish your trip?" And he answered: "California!" So, from what he said it looks as though he's making some sort of a "hooparang" expedition. Anyway, his looks and appearance certainly were reminiscent of the long-ago days in the west.

Of course, I wanted to call on the editor of the Tombstone Epitaph. Some 25 years ago I was in Tombstone while making a western auto trip, and visited The Epitaph's office.

For 82 years that weekly newspaper has been coming out... two years less than The Eccentric has, remembered it, and so far as I could see, it was just as "out of antidy—like a country newspaper is supposed to be." (I've seen similar offices in Michigan, too.)

Annually, The Epitaph gets out a "Tombstone Helldorado" edition, containing a good deal of the early history of that rip-roaring area. The town and the nearby crossroads Arizona stage a three-day civic holiday. Brief pageants and sketches of early activities are put on by some of the Tombstonians.

These old headlines certainly prove that early Tombstone days and nights, including Sundays, were far from being quiet. Indeed, a brief visit to the town's Boot Hill Cemetery offers eloquent proof of the dangerous days that attended the white man's first efforts to dig mineral wealth from the earth, in the Tombstone area.

MOST OF THE BUSINESS buildings in Tombstone are kept about as they were before the turn of the century. Numerous western motion picture themes have been dedicated to Tombstone, and some of its "bad characters" were portrayed, I'm told.

But its youngsters (which includes some of the Indian families who live just about everywhere through New Mexico and Arizona) have become oriented to its pagantry... to school... to laugh and live... and many of them probably will spend their mature years in other parts of the Big U.S.A.

New Mexico, of course, as well as Arizona, contains thousands of little and large ranches. New Mexico produces some oil, some minerals, also grows good cotton... and so does Arizona, which state tells you it is strong in the production of the "three C's... copper, cotton and cattle."

But enough for the moment. Next week I'll report on Tucson and Phoenix... perhaps the two fastest growing cities in the United States!
