

Former Area GOP Exec Plans Election Drive

John A. (Jack) Gibbs, former executive secretary of the Oakland County Republican organization and present administrator of the Republican State Central Committee, has been named the newly created post of campaign coordinator for the 1962 election.

GOP Chairman George M. VanPurse, in his announcement of the appointment, said the job entails the planning, organizing and guidance of the statewide campaign. Gibbs' new duties will be in addition to his present job as executive assistant to the State Chairman.

Before joining the state organization last year, the 29-year-old executive spent four years as executive secretary of the Oakland County Republican organization.

DURING GIBBS' stewardship, the Oakland GOP developed into one of the best political groups in the state. When he joined the staff in 1957, the 18th district Republicans were accounting for 50.6 percent of the vote. By 1960 Gibbs and his staff rolled up a 51 percent total, permitting the GOP to sweep 21 of 27 elective offices in the heavily populated county.

"We built our county organization on the sound principles of research, education, promotion,

finance and thorough precinct organization," said Gibbs. "I'm sure the same guidelines apply at the state level."

Gibbs considers the GOP's first election year assignment to be find and register Republican voters.

STATE CENTRAL'S five-member board is now at work here being county party leaders set up the new VIP—Voted Identification Program.

The field organizers are headed by Mrs. Ely Peterson, the first woman to hold such an office in the Michigan Republican Party.

"When we finish the organization phase we'll know where every Republican voter lives. In the state," predicts Gibbs. "Then we'll tap this force for campaign workers."

The party goal, Gibbs added, will be the continued development of an active citizens' party. It will function as a campaign team during the election year and as an issue sales force in off years.

LATER IN THE campaign Gibbs will direct liaison between candidates and the state organization, oversee the scheduling of state candidates, and coordinate


