**Auto Dealers Group
Appeals to Legislature**

Lansing—The Michigan Automobile Dealers Association has called upon the State Legislature to impose no additional taxes on the automotive industry and buying public and urged relief for the person trading in a car on another automobile.

Gilbert L. Haley, executive vice president of the dealer organization, made the appeal to a Senate Committee conducting a hearing on legislation which would allow the dealer to pass on to a customer the tax on labor services.

Also opposing other Senate bills, Haley said "We feel this is very unjustified because in the year 1953 Business Activities Tax was enacted which put a tax on salaries which the dealer is now paying at the rate of \$7.75 per thousand."

CRITICAL OF THE proposed measure (Senate Bill 1379), Haley emphasized that the dealer association feels "that this is just another tax on tax. We also feel this is very unjustified because at the present time, when an individual gets his car repaired, he pays tax on the parts and is allowed an exemption as far as tax on labor."

"When this customer trades his car in an automobile dealer as a trade-in on a new or used car there is no allowance for the trade-in and so again double taxation is on the automobile," he declared.

In relation to the latter situation, the dealer spokesman suggested tax credit be given the man trading an automobile in on another vehicle. Senate Bills 1062 and 1093, introduced by Sen. Charles O. McManman of Houghton, would make it possible for a person trading in a car to pay tax only on the difference.

**Panel Talks
Explore
Tariff, Trade**

The subjects of tariff and trade underwent thorough exploration by a group of industrial representatives Monday night at a meeting sponsored by the Birmingham League of Women Voters in the Community House.

The meeting, attended by the Allen Park delegation of the League of Women Voters and the retiring class of Seaholm High School, considered "Trade Factors for the Sixties."

Varying opinions set forth by a four-member panel proved particularly timely in view of the debate currently in progress before the U. S. House Ways and Means Committee on the Trade Expansion Act.

DR. JAMES FLETCHER, of Chrysler Corp's Public Relations Department, felt that lower tariff is important, if not vital, but that they are not a cure-all.

Mal Evans, assistant director of United Automobile Workers Education Department, questioned whether or not the U. S. can produce living standards which will influence people to turn their backs on what Communism has to offer.

Howard V. Clark, executive vice president of Detroit Steel Corp., thought that the U. S. might be rushing into trade reductions too fast.

AND DR. LEWIS E. LLOYD, economist with Dew Chemical Co., traced the basic economics of trade suggested that injury and damage may take place if U. S. has too rapid an economic change. He said Japan has purposely held back its growth, and that the U.S. should pause before forcing wage reduction.

ALSO OPPOSED by the dealer association, is Senate Bill 1341, he told the Senate committee members, called another "double taxation" measure and added: "May I say this is the type of legislation which brings up the

**Address Changes
For Income Taxes**

R. I. Nixon, District Director of Internal Revenue, issued a word of advice for taxpayers who change their address during the year.

Nixon said that taxpayers who change address should submit POD Form 3573 to the District Director of Internal Revenue, Detroit 31, Michigan. This is in addition to the regular change of address form filed with the Post Office.

The director said that this is especially important if you are expecting a refund. Many refund checks are returned to the District office each year because taxpayers did not leave a proper forwarding address. He added that along with Form 3573, the taxpayers should show their social security number and indicate whether a joint or separate return was filed.

THIS PROCEDURE, he said, will make it possible for the Revenue Service to forward refund checks without delay to the taxpayer.

POD Form 3573 can be obtained from the local Post Office.

Accidents Alarm
B'ham Police**

Due to an "alarming number of right angle accidents" at Hunter (U.S.-10) and Haynes, traffic surveys will be made at that intersection and at Hunter and Bowers, Police Chief Ralph W. Moxley informed Birmingham city commissioners Monday night.

Remedial measures will be suggested upon completion of the survey, Moxley reported.

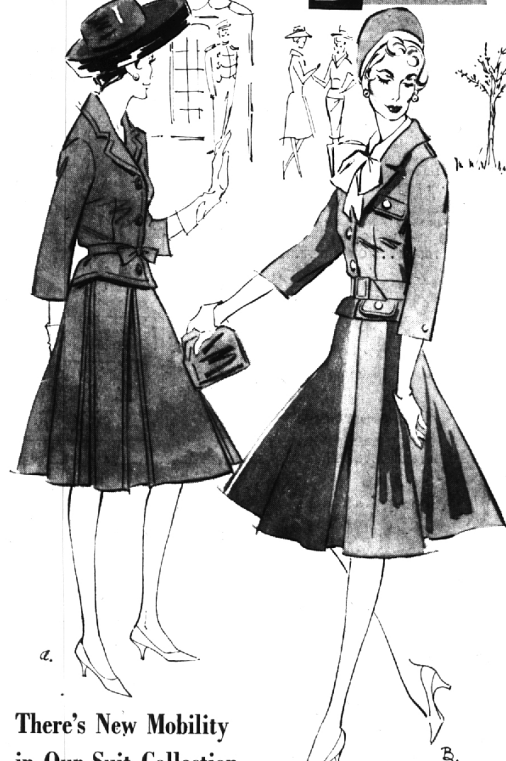
At Hunter and Haynes, 22 accidents occurred during the past 13½ months, Moxley said. Of these, 10 were classified as right-angle accidents. Seven were caused by improper lane changing.

TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS were listed as the causative factor in all 22 mishaps, Moxley noted.

The police department will step up enforcement of regulations at both the Hunter-Haynes and the Hunter-Chapin intersections, he said. Eleven accidents were listed for the latter.

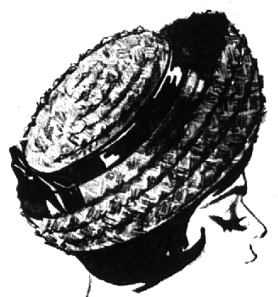
**Oakl'd Accountants
