### Group Holding Social Work Lecture Series

Dr. Ralph Rabinovitch, noted child psychiatrist and director of the Hawthorn Center for emotionally disturbed children, was the first speaker in the four part lecture series sponsored by the Oakland County Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers.

Dr. Rabinovitch appeared at the United Fund Building in Pontiac, 132 Franklin Blvd. on March 20. 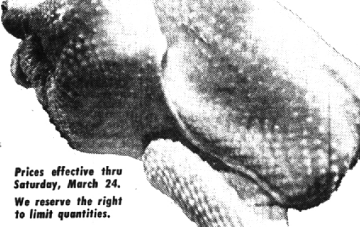

The church is located at 4230 Livernois—2 blocks north of Watkins (17 Mile Road).

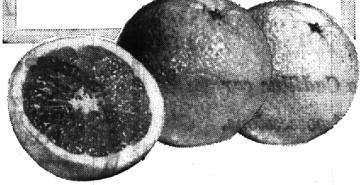
