Boiler Explosion Jolts B'field Hills Jr. High

BLOOMFIELD TOWNSHIP — Some 1,000 students at the Bloomfield Hills Junior High escaped injury Friday morning when an explosion ripped the buildings' boiler room. There was no fire.

Flues and stacks were torn loose and the cement wall between the boiler room and a school corridor was peppered with gaping cracks.

THE STUDENTS re-entered the building after police and utility company workmen checked the building and shut off the gas supply.
