This is the last of a series of four lectures on "Secure Your Future"—how women can prepare themselves financially for the future.

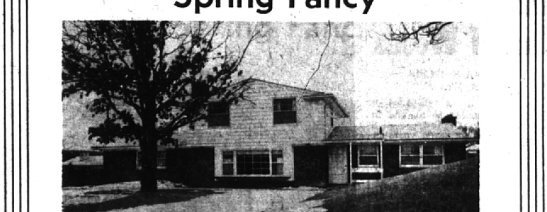

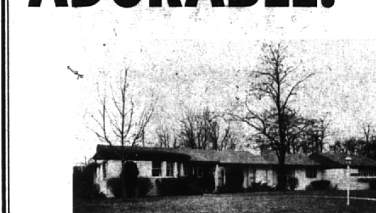

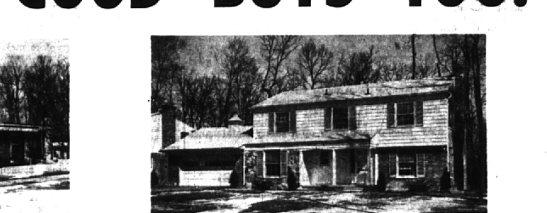
