Lathrup, County Confer On S'field Road Project

LATHRUP — City Attorney Everett Hayes told council Monday that he was still negotiating a contract with the Oakland County Road Commission for widening of Southfield and 12 Mile Road. Hayes said a new agreement provided that 11 Mile Road would be under the jurisdiction of the city but that the county would make minor base repairs and seal-coat the surface first.

HAYES INDICATED that he

tunneling under the road after it is widened.

ELEVEN OF these crossovers—nine north and two south of 11 Mile—are included in the \$525,000 storm sewer plan.

An additional three more to the north and the same number south of 11 Mile should also be installed, he said. The latter three crossovers will be necessary, he said, to serve Louise Kelley land in accordance with a recent court ruling in a suit brought by Mrs. Kelley.

Mayor Richard N. Cogger said Lathrup has not agreed to drain Southfield Road, south of 11 Mile. A \$24,000 credit from the county will cover drainage of South-

field north of Meadowood, including 11 crossovers.

Resident Complains About Traffic Noise On Lathrup Street

LATHRUP — Police Chief Tom Tellefsen will report in one month on traffic conditions on Roseland Avenue, at council's request.

The request followed receipt of a letter from a Roseland resident who complained of traffic noise and said that non-residents were using the street to bypass 12 Mile and Southfield Road traffic and traffic light.

THE RESIDENT, asking that her name be withheld, suggested that through-traffic on Roseland be prohibited, that larger "no-through-traffic" signs be used, and enforcement be "stepped up."
