CONTINUED in the religious line, villagers attend Ascension Lutheran, Nativity Episcopal, Beverly Hills Methodist, Beverly Hills Baptist and Queen of Martyrs. Again, many villagers must travel to nearby Birmingham, Southfield, Royal Oak and Franklin to attend the churches of their choice.

About half of the village's residents are between the ages of 30 and 60. Youthful, they enjoy many out door activities and social outings.

It follows that many are members of the Birmingham Country Club, Oakland Hills and other social centers where sports and athletics are offered.

THE RECENTLY constructed Beverly Hills Athletic Club has answered the sun and swim dream for about 300 families. Groves High tennis courts, swimming pool, ball fields and gym also provide recreational headquarters.

A large but mostly unused Dodge Park on Beverly Road is available too. The 40-acre site has many possibilities but inadequate policing and frequent vandalism make the park's development impractical.

BUILDING activity has heightened in Beverly Hills during the last few years. Subdivisions have been going in Nottingham Forest, Lincolnshire, Huntley and Greenwich Green.

Other structures that have gone up include Groves High, the Beverly Hills Athletic Club and a Wrigley's on the way. Medical Village Inc., the Public Bank, Beverly Hills Methodist permanent building and numerous residential dwellings are planned to go up soon.

IT WON'T be too many years from now when the face of Beverly Hills will be nature. The slow movement of suburbanization has reached it.

Money for erection of the home has been a project of the guilds of St. James and Christ Church Cranbrook, Episcopal churches in the area.

SPOKESMEN FOR the church groups told the board that a substantial amount for the construction had been raised.

They described the project as similar to Presbyterian Village in Redford Township.

It would be restricted to 48 to 50 residents of retirement age in good health. They would have individual room suites. There would be a common dining-hall, recreation rooms and hobby areas.

THREE OF the audience of 15 to 20 people attending the public hearing voiced objections to the

location of St. Ann's Meads. Two were from nearby subdivision. One was a resident of Bloomfield Hills.

No decision was made by the board after the public hearing. Its decision was handed down at a special meeting early this month.

The appeals board attempted to side step the matter last fall when it declared that it did not come under its jurisdiction, as the zoning ordinance had no classification for retirement homes.

An appeal was made to the Circuit Court and Judge Adams ruled that it was in the appeals board's province to decide but reserved review of the board's decision.

A new type of steel curtain wall has been developed which has both insulation and heating element built into a thin sandwich. There is also a heat reflector which faces the inside.

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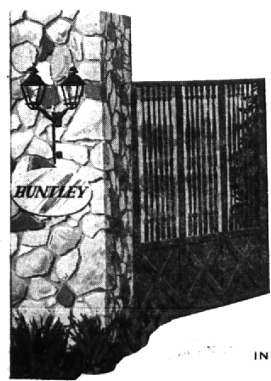
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
