

Propose School Attendance Boundary Changes

Following are an explanation and illustration of the new attendance area boundaries for Birmingham's elementary schools which are proposed for September 1. Since only elementary school attendance area boundaries are proposed for adjustment, those for senior and junior high schools are described but not illustrated.

Note: Each differently designed or shaded section on the illustration represents the attendance area for the school located in that section.

SENIOR HIGH

SEAHOLM—All of the school district north of Fourteen Mile Road except the attendance areas of the Walnut Lake and Meadow Lake elementary schools.

GROVES—All of the school district south of Fourteen Mile Road plus the attendance areas of the Walnut Lake and Meadow Lake elementary schools.

JUNIOR HIGH

BARNUM—that portion of the school district within the limits of the City of Birmingham which is west of Woodward.

DERBY—that portion of the school district north of Fourteen Mile Road and east of Telegraph.

except the area within the limits of the City of Birmingham which is west of Woodward.

GROVES—that portion of the school district south of Fourteen Mile Road and including the attendance areas of the Walnut Lake and Meadow Lake elementary schools.

ELEMENTARY

ADAMS—Starting at the northeast corner of the Adams attendance area; from the corner of Big Beaver and Adams Road, west on Big Beaver to Rouge River (between Oxford and Brookdale Park Roads); south along the Rouge River to Woodward Avenue; south-east on Woodward Avenue to the corner of Adams and Woodward; north on Adams to the back lot line of the properties facing the south side of Bowers; east along this property line and a line projected to the Grand Trunk Railroad; northwest along Grand Trunk Railroad to Adams Road; east, north and south on Adams to the point of origin.

BALDWIN—Starting at the northeast corner of the Baldwin attendance area; from Woodward and Redding to Rouge River; south along Rouge River to West Maple; west on West Maple to the point of the back lot line of homes facing

Linden on the west side; south on this line projected to Lincoln; east on Lincoln to Rouge River; south along Rouge River to the Birmingham city limits; east and south on the line of the Birmingham city limits to Fourteen Mile Road; east on Fourteen Mile Road to Southfield; north on Southfield to Lincoln; east on Lincoln to Wood Avenue; and northwest on Wood Avenue to the point of origin.

BEVERLY—Starting at the northeast corner of the Beverly attendance area; from the corner of Fourteen Mile Road and Pierce; west following the Birmingham city limits to the corner of Fourteen Mile-Cranbrook-Evergreen; south on Evergreen Road to Thirteen Mile Road; east on Thirteen Mile Road for 1300' and south to the school district boundary; east and north along school district boundary to Thirteen Mile Road; east on Thirteen Mile Road to the east property line of Lot #41, Arteston Heights Subdivision; north on this property line to the Acacia Park Cemetery; east and north on the cemetery property line of Beverly; east on Beverly Road to the

point of origin.

BLOOMFIELD—Starting at the northeast corner of the Bloomfield attendance area; from a point on the school district boundary intersected by a northern projection of Covington, west and south along this property line projected to Thirteen Mile Road; west on Thirteen Mile Road to a point intersecting the school district boundary south, east and north to the point of origin.

FRANKLIN—Starting at the northeast corner of the Franklin attendance area; from the corner of Telegraph and Fourteen Mile Road, west along Fourteen Mile Road to Inkster Road; south and east on the school district boundary to Telegraph; north on Telegraph to the point of origin.

GREENHILL—Starting at the northeast corner of the Greenfield attendance area; from the corner

of Fourteen Mile Road and Greenfield; west along Fourteen Mile Road to Pierce; south on Pierce to Beverly; west on Beverly to the east property line of the Acacia Park Cemetery; south on the cemetery property line to the east property line of Lot #28, Arteston Heights Subdivision; south on this property line projected to Thirteen Mile Road; west on Thirteen Mile Road to a point intersecting the school district boundary south, east and north to the point of origin.

HARLAN—Starting at the northeast corner of the Harlan attendance area; from the intersection of North Adams and the school district boundary, west and south following the school district boundary to Woodward; southeast on Woodward to Rouge River; north on the Rouge River to Big Beaver; east on Big Beaver to school district boundary; north and west following the school district boundary to the point of origin.

MEADOW LAKE—Starting at the northeast corner of the Meadowlake attendance area; from the intersection of the school district boundary and Quarter Road, west on Quarter to the west property line of Lot #120, Kirkwood Subdivision; south on this line projected to West Maple; west on West Maple to the school district boundary; south and east following the district boundary to the intersection of Fourteen Mile Road and the Village of Franklin limits; east on Fourteen Mile to the school district boundary; north and east following the district boundary to the point of origin.

MIDVALE—Starting at the northeast corner of the Midvale attendance area; from the intersection of West Maple Road and Shirley Drive, west on Maple to Cranbrook; south on Cranbrook to North Lawn Drive; east along North Lawn to the Rouge River; north on the Rouge River to Lincoln Avenue; west along Lincoln Avenue to a point intersected by a projection of the back property lot line of homes facing the west side of Linden Avenue; north along this projected

line to the point of origin.

PEMBROKE—Starting at the northeast corner of the Pembroke attendance area; from the intersection of Big Beaver Road and the eastern district boundary, west on Big Beaver to Adams Road and the eastern school district boundary, west on Big Beaver to Adams Road; south on Adams to the Grand Trunk Railroad; south along the Grand Trunk Railroad to Maple; east on Maple to the school district boundary; north and west following the school district boundary to the point of origin.

PIERCE—Starting at the northeast corner of the Pierce attendance area; from the corner of Lincoln and Woodward; west along Lincoln to Southfield; south on Southfield to Fourteen Mile Road; east along Fourteen Mile Road to Woodward; northwest along Woodward to the point of origin.

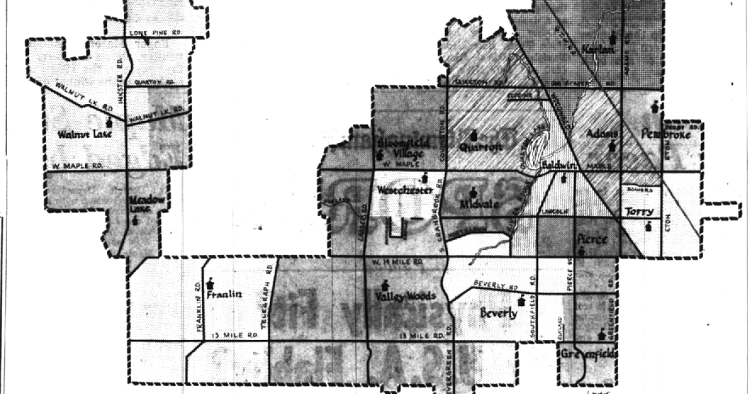
QUARTON—Starting at the northeast corner of the Quarton attendance area; from the intersection of the northern school district boundary and Woodward, west and south following the school district boundary to a point of intersection with a north projection of Covington; south on this line of projection along the Grand Trunk to the Rouge River; north along Rouge River to Redding; east on Redding to Woodward; northwest on Woodward to the point of origin.

TORRY—Starting at the northeast corner of the Torry attendance area; from the intersection of East Maple and the eastern school district boundary, west on Maple to the Grand Trunk Railroad; south along the Grand Trunk to the intersection of the line projected from the back lot line of the properties facing the south side of Bowers; west along this projected line and other properties facing the south side of Bowers to Adams Road; south on Adams to Woodward; southeast on Woodward to the school district boundary; east and north following the district boundary to the point of origin.

VALLEY WOODS—Starting at the northeast corner of the Valley Woods attendance area; from the corner of Lincoln and Cranbrook; west along an imaginary extension of Lincoln to Lahser excluding all properties facing Bradford Drive East and East Breckridge Lane; north on Lahser to the south property line of Oakland Hills Country Club; west on this property line to its intersection with the school district boundary; south and west following the school district boundary to Telegraph; south on Telegraph to the school district boundary to the school district boundary to a point approximately 1300' east of Evergreen; north on the school district boundary and a line projected to Thirteen Mile Road; west on Thirteen Mile to Evergreen; north on Evergreen and Cranbrook to the point of origin.

WALNUT LAKE—Starting at the northeast corner of the Walnut Lake attendance area; from the intersection of the northern school district boundary and Franklin Road, west and south following the school district boundary to West Maple; east and south Maple to the west property line of Lot #15, The Brees of Bloomfield Subdivision; north on this property line projected to Quarter Road; east on Quarter Road to the school district boundary; north following the school district boundary to the point of origin.

WESTCHESTER—Starting at the northeast corner of the Westchester attendance area; from the corner of Cranbrook and West Maple; west along Maple to Lahser; south along Lahser to the intersection of Lincoln; east along an imaginary extension of Lincoln to Cranbrook including all properties facing East Breckridge Lane and Bradford Drive East; north on Cranbrook to point of origin.

BUT, there is no reason YOU should be any LATER than you already are. The few nice days we have had convince us that there will soon be many more.

THINGS TO BE DONE:

CLEAN-UP the yard. A light raking or sweeping will do nicely—don't gouge it. (Don't do the flower or shrubbery beds yet!)

FERTILIZE the lawn. Use a good standard weight fertilizer: 10-6-4 analysis—at a rate of 20 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft. This is still the best buy. It is not necessary to use a non-burning type, as the lawn will not burn, nor is the slow nitrogen release needed at this time.

PREVENT CRABGRASS. If you had it last year, you will have it this year—worse. If you don't want it, use a good pre-emergent killer at the manufacturer's recommended rate. Time of application is important and varies with the kind used. Ask us.

SEED. Use a good grade of the proper kind for its location. In seed you get just what you pay for. Don't waste it. Lush, thick, vigorous lawns are NOT built by promiscuously pitching pounds of precious seed around. Also DON'T seed now if you use a crab-grass killer at this time. There are exceptions to this—ask us.

PRUNE—Shade trees, fruit trees and evergreens NOW—before the sap begins to flow. Early flowering ornamental trees and shrubs should be pruned LATER, after they bloom.

DORMANT SPRAY—to kill over-wintering insects and diseases. Should be applied to fruit trees and ornamentals (except evergreens) when the temperature will be above 40 degrees for 6 to 8 hours, but before the buds begin to open. To be effective the spray must be a drench that covers every twig and gets into every crevice of the bark.

THINGS TO DO IT WITH; (we recommend):

CLEAN-UP—with a spring tooth rake of steel (True Temper) or bamboo (Maguire).

FERTILIZE—with Agricor for turf 10-6-4, Stallers XXX 10-6-4, or Agrico Grass food U.F. 10-6-4.

PREVENT CRABGRASS—with Dow Zyrton, Agricor Pre-emerge, Pax, or Liquid 72% Chlordane.

SPREAD your fertilizer and/or crabgrass killer with a Lawn Beauty Cyclone, or Stadler spreader; one of our used spreaders (last year's loaners on sale now at ridiculously low prices); or one of our loaners.

SEED: With one of our four seed mixtures prepared especially for us and this area; or with one of the many pure straight seeds suitable for your location.

PRUNE—with one or more of the many shears, pruners, clippers or saws to fit your job.

DORMANT SPRAY—with Lime Sulphur, Sealcide or Volck Oil, and use a Bean Oakes tank sprayer, & G S Master trombone sprayer, or a Hayes "nose-end" sprayer.
