J. King Ward, president of the Oakland Society for Crippled Children and Adults, announced the launching of the drive designed to help the society in carrying on its work for the welfare of crippled children and adults.

The Society receives no financial support from the state or county, or from any other body to carry on its program, and relies only on citizens' contributive contributions to the Easter Seal Drive.

### Korean Veterans Urged to Check School Status

Many Michigan Korean veterans who are attending night school, or are taking part-time training under the Korean GI Bill, should consider accelerating their training if they wish to complete their courses before their GI benefits terminate, said R. M. Fitzgerald, manager of the VA Regional Office in Detroit. He pointed out that a number of veterans in training are going to lose out at the rate they are now going.

Under the law, a Korean veteran's termination date is eight years from the date of his discharge or release from active duty. Except for the rehabilitation program, all GI training ends Jan. 31, 1968.

MICHIGAN has more than 4,500 veterans in training at this time. The majority attend institutions of higher learning on a full-time basis. Others, however, attend at night, or maintain their training on a part-time basis while they earn a living. It is this latter group which faces deadline difficulties, Fitzgerald explained.

He pointed out that a Korean veteran discharged in 1965 faces a termination date next year.

Fitzgerald suggested that all veterans taking Korean GI Bill training check their individual termination dates. Some full-time students will find they will have to take additional courses or attend summer school to get maximum benefits.

## Residents Are Delegates To 41st MEA Assembly

George Miller and Mrs. Charlotte Richards of Birmingham, have been named special delegates to the 41st annual representative assembly of the Michigan Education Association (MEA) to be held in Lansing, April 5-7.

Scheduled for the Lansing Civic Center, the annual conference of the MEA's governing body is expected to attract more than 500 teachers and administrators from Michigan. Each of the association's 179 districts will send delegates to the policy-making assembly.

Keynote speaker will be Dr. Judson W. Foust, president, Central Michigan University, who will address educators attending the banquet, April 6, at 6:15 p. m.

DELEGATES TO the assembly will concentrate on establishing a program of action for the MEA in 1962-63, formulating policies, adopting a budget, electing officers, and discussing the proposed revision of the MEA constitution. The delegates will direct the MEA Constitutional Revision Committee in drafting a revised constitution to be presented to delegates attending the 1963 Representative Assembly.

The educators also will focus attention on federal support for education, regional conferences, the state constitutional convention, and election to commissions and committees.

Highlight of the assembly will be the presentation of the annual Distinguished Service Award to the person who has made an outstanding contribution to education in Michigan.

ALSO FEATURED at the conference will be the presentation of School Bell Awards to members of the mass communications media (press, radio, television) for distinguished and comprehensive coverage of public education in Michigan during 1961. This will mark the third annual School Bell Award presentation.

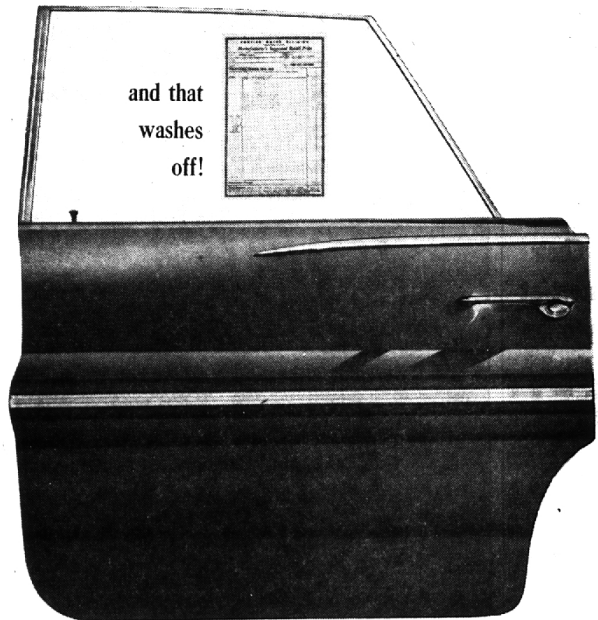
