Gov. Swainson Presents Flag To Girl Scouts

Southern Oakland Girl Scout Office in Berkeley was the scene of an unusual presentation ceremony Sunday as the Senior Scout Round-up Patrol, chosen to represent Southern Oakland at the National Girl Scout Roundup, Buxton Bay, Vt., were the recipients of a flag of historical significance selected for them by Gov. John B. Swainson.

The Patrol's search for such a flag had proved fruitless until it came to the Governor's attention. Touched by their request and pleased to honor a group so typical of Michigan Girl Scouts, the flag, a hand-loomed, hand-sewn Naval Flag used by a Michigan Unit during the Civil War, was presented to the girls by the Governor's personal emissary, Mrs. Marie Shippee, Farmington, at the 3 p.m. ceremony.

Chosen to receive the banner were the Patrol Leaders and Assistant Leaders of the four Round-up Patrols. From Patrol A, Marcia Duval and Jeanette Rucinski, Birmingham; Patrol B, Diane Frechette, Farmington-Novi and Cheryl Griffin, Southfield; Patrol C, Sandy Turf, Birmingham, and Jackie Bacon, Southfield; Patrol D, Beverley Williams, Troy, and Marilyn Mason, Birmingham.

The original flag request had reached the Governor from Patrol B, and so Mrs. Shippee presented to them a flag of the State of Michigan. The State flag was in use in the Persian Gulf Command and flew as a gesture of international friendship July 4, 1945, on the British Island of Awa in the Persian Gulf.

Classmates' Troth Is Announced By Parents

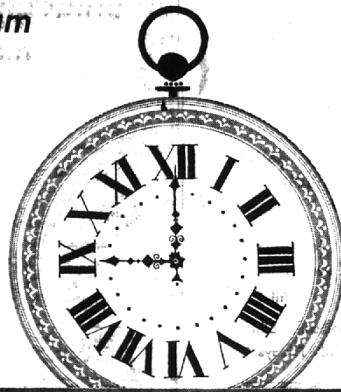

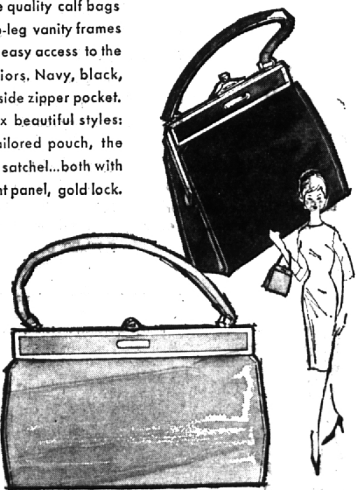
