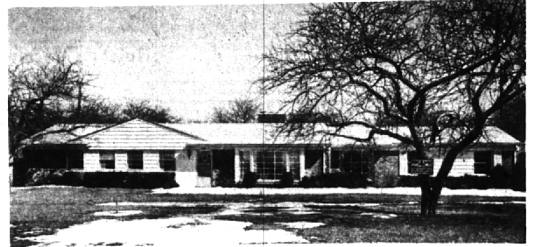

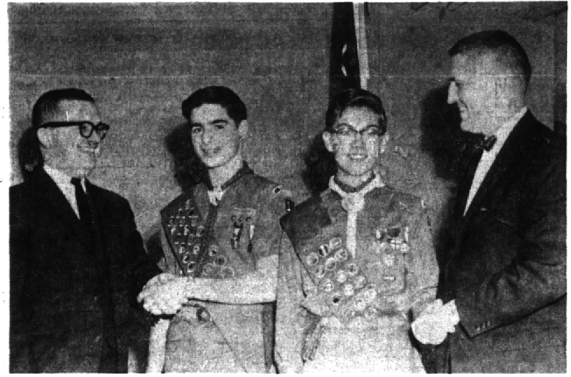

## Franklin Council Duties, Road Reps Reassigned

FRANKLIN—With two of its newly elected councilmen absent, the village council nevertheless met for an organizational session Monday night to take the oath of office for another year, assign responsibilities and make preliminary study of budget matters.

J. Robert Mitchell, starting his fourth term, and George M. Howard, newcomer to the official family, joined councilmen Robert Winkler and Don Hunter to make a quorum. Top vote getter, Richard Ober-schulte, and one-year councilman, Edmond Webb, were out of town. However, Oberschulte submitted a detailed report for his colleagues to consider in his absence which served as official acknowledgment of his appointment as Franklin's among the new street commissioner and road administrator.

ASKING the unanimous support of the council for his clearly defined appraisal of the duties involved, Oberschulte also spelled out a protective format to be followed by his constituents, designed to minimize the wear and tear on his private life if he assumes the responsibility.

Cognizant of the pitfalls faced by his predecessors, Oberschulte wants all road complaints changed, noted directly to the village clerk or area road representatives. They will fill out special forms so that road grievances can be handled personally and more efficiently by proper authorities.

He also submitted a new list of area representatives, including of his appointment as Franklin's among the new street commissioner and road administrator.

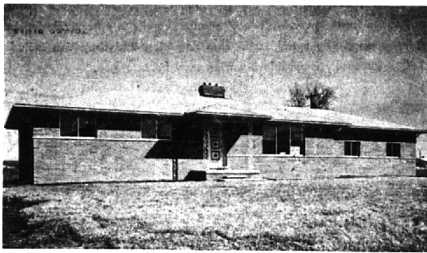

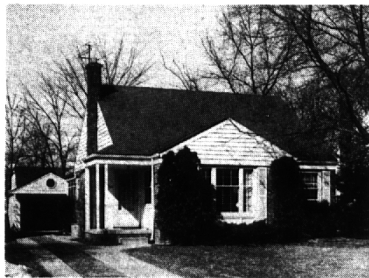

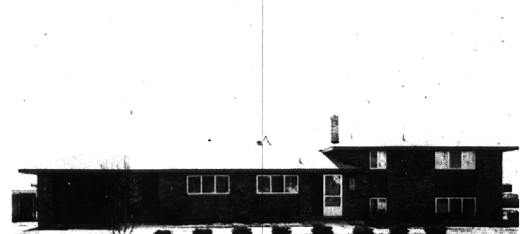
