## Bingham Politicians Take Over Duties

**BINGHAM FARMS** - Retiring Villian Clark Mrs. Jean Kalmbach proved herself a good scout Monday night.

Appearing for Bingham's new council organizational meeting, she sat alongside her successor, Mrs. Evelyn Whybrow, to guide her through the new clerk's duties.

Fortunately for the new clerk and the three new councilmen, Ray Shearer, Vern Vesper and Dr. Paul Bartlett, the month's business was relatively unimportant.

They cut their political eye-teeth on such matters as a request for gas street-lighting at the intersection of 13 Mile and Bristol Lane; assignment of council responsibilities; a road report and "how-to" make the village marshal more official.

**COUNCILMAN** Donald Morse announced he would officially resign from his post as the council and his duties as street administrator at the April meeting. Morse is moving to Birmingham.

He told his colleagues only emergency repair could be expected on road until the frost had fully lifted.

**FORMER COUNCILMEN** Evan Reim and John Gress appeared at the meeting to get direction from the council in getting information on costs and financing for black-topping the Bristol Lane area.

They were urged to get approval signatures on petitions from better than 60 per cent of the property owners in the district if the council is to authorize the work.

Reformers will be installed as a temporary measure to mark the transition to Bristol Lane, they were also told, after requesting gas street lights. Maintenance costs of gas and electrical types will be investigated.

**PRESIDENT HASKALL** Wright appointed Donald A. Johnston Jr. as president pro tem and sewer commissioner. Dr. Bartlett will handle drain problems; Vesper, fire department and Shearer, rubbish collection.

The council also agreed that the village marshal should carry official credentials of the village to enhance his authority to enforce "no parking" restrictions on the road.

An effort to have the marshal deputized by the Oakland county sheriff's office was also considered.

## GOP Engages Mills Trio For GO-Party

One of America's foremost singing combinations has been signed for an appearance as part of a "Hollywood Spectacular GO-Party" to be presented by the Republican Committee of Oakland County May 26.

## Comparing Compact Cars

If you're comparing cars, be careful of your descriptions when talking to Birmingham Commissioner Robert Page.

Page, a Fort executive, questioned a statement by DPW Sup't. T. C. Brien in his report Monday night on bids for replacement of two cars for the police department.

Brien recommended acceptance of the low bid of \$1,982.52 for Dodge Durts from Murphy Motor Sales, Detroit.

The cars are to replace two Ramblers, purchased in March, 1961.

"THE DODGE," said Brien, "is 3 inches shorter in wheelbase than Ford or Chevrolet, and is also about 350 pounds lighter than the standard cars.

All other features, such as engine, transmission, tire size, brakes, springs, shock absorbers, etc., are comparable with the Ford and Chevrolet. All the units bid meet the City's specifications."

Just how are they partitioned? he asked Page. He questioned whether some of the features on the Dodges were equal to those on the other two makes.

They are comparable, explained Brien, insofar as they meet the specifications set up by the department and public works departments.

WHAT ABOUT the Ramblers? asked Commissioner William E. Roberts. Did the police department encounter any problems insofar as the size of its men are concerned?

The problem, said Chief of Police Ralph W. Moxley, Commissioner Carl F. Ingraham's motion to accept the low bid passed unanimously.

## County Budget To Be Studied

Hearings are being held this week before the ways and means committee of Oakland County Board of Supervisors on the proposed 1963 Oakland county budget.

The County Board of Auditors has submitted a tentative budget of \$16,673,208 which exceeds last year's budget by \$1,827,622.

To meet the increased figure, the auditor's recommendation is that the county's share of the 15-mil property tax be raised from the present allotment of 5.25 mills to 5.96 mills.

The committee has until April 10 to revise budget figures submitted by county departmental heads, who will appear before the committee to defend their projected operating costs.

At that time it goes before the County Board of Supervisors.

**MAJOR INCREASES** proposed in the budget include a \$247,900 increase in salaries bringing this item to \$7,261,105. The increase would be used to create new positions.
