Among those displayed will be two recent award winners—"Once a Mouse," awarded the Caldecott medal as the most outstanding picture book of the year, and "The Bronze Bow"—winner of the Newbery medal, as the most outstanding book for older children.

A NEW JACOBSON'S Fine Arts Gallery opened in Birmingham April 4. Mrs. James Yaw (Nancy) and her mother, Mrs. Leo Lenke, are merchandizing directors.

Since November, they have been assembling the collection, which now totals over 100 original paintings (many of which are by local artists) and over 100 reproductions.

Southern Michigan Bridge Association runs a team-of-four bridge tournament each year for all its members. Winner of the Oakland County section is the team captained by Birmingham's George Alderton III.

One of the younger and newer players now has risen to a high position in bridge. His victory in this team match was won over teams whose members included life masters.

Today's hand was played in this team-of-four match and gave George's team a huge score advantage.

Opening lead, Heart king.  
 South won the opening lead with his ace and counted 12 top tricks for a total of 1,680 points.

In the other room, where George's East and West team were defending against this hand, North opened the bidding with one club and South bid one heart. East

and West did not enter the bidding.

North's second bid was four hearts and South then went into Blackwood, and arrived at a six-heart bid that was defeated, one trick, doubled, for a score of 100. For the balance of this match, George's opposition could not overcome this 1,780 point lead.

**RECENT WINNERS** at the Wednesday night tournament at the Y.M.C.A. in Birmingham were Henry Georgia and John Norcen who tied with North and South Paula Cohen and Terry O'Hearn. Winners East and West were Evelyn and Tom Taylor who tied with Dr. Charles Patrick and Richard McCarry.

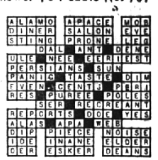
## Local Actor In Ridgedale

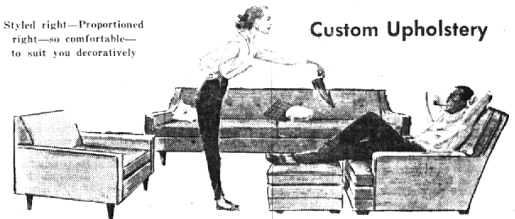
