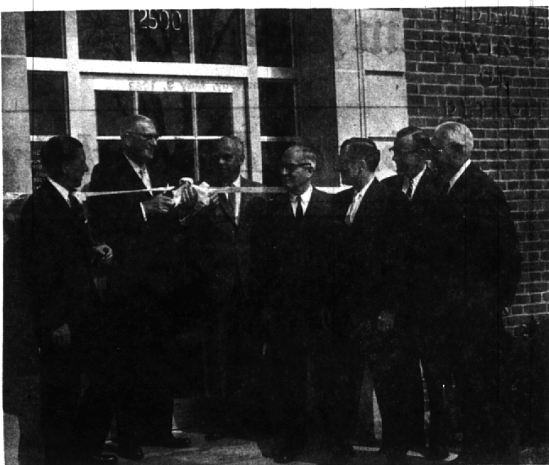

Foundation Offers MSU Scholarship

Robert M. Nelson, president of the Home Builders Foundation of Michigan State University, today stressed the need for more technically trained college graduates in the home building industry.

"We must do more to encourage promising students to enter the field of home building which has become one of the largest industries in the country," Nelson said.

He coupled his remarks with an announcement that the Foundation is awarding a new scholarship this year.

IT WILL BE PRESENTED annually to the outstanding sophomore in the home building curriculum at MSU, said Nelson, head of the Percy M. Nelson, Inc., builders and insurance in Birmingham.

The Foundation is a non-profit corporation organized and founded by members of the home building industry to sponsor research and promote the educational program in home building at MSU.

Nelson said that MSU is one of the few universities in the country that offer a complete curriculum in home building. The course includes studies in civil engineering, finance, landscape construction and mechanical drawing.

He said that about 75 MSU students are taking the curriculum.

The demand for such specially trained students is great and graduates are snapped up quickly by the industry," Nelson said.

The first recipient of the Foundation \$100 Sophomore award will be James D. Myers, 28, of Bear Lake, Michigan.

Nelson will present the honor to Myers at the 13th annual awards banquet of Sigma Lambda Chi, honorary construction fraternity, today at East Lansing.

NEWS OF BUSINESS

First Federal Reports Record Mortgage High

A record high of \$300,465,536.54 in mortgage loans for First Federal Savings of Detroit was reported by Hans Gehrke, Jr., association president.

Commenting on First Federal's first-quarter report as of March 31, Gehrke said that the association's portfolio of mortgages was the largest of any Michigan financial institution, besides being the first to pass the \$300 million mark on mortgage loans.

Gains for First Federal in the first quarter of 1962 included the addition of \$21,257,000 worth of mortgages to the portfolio. During the same period, Gehrke said, payments and discharges totaled \$7,802,900 for a net gain of \$14,456,000.

First Federal's savings customers received \$1,415,304 in earnings at the close of the first quarter. Total earnings for the period were \$349,160,000.

FIRST FEDERAL'S quarterly report bears out predictions made late in 1961 by Gehrke that 1962 would produce abundant evidence of the soundness of Michigan's economy, particularly in ability of the average family to live within its means and save money.

"This first-quarter report," said Gehrke, "more than justifies our faith in the future of Michigan. Our facilities for handling new business as well as servicing thousands of old customers are being enlarged this year."

"Our new branch in Oakland County, at Maple and Cranbrook Roads, Bloomfield Township, will be finished and opened later this month."

"Work on construction of our second new branch in Oakland County, at Farmington and Slocum Roads, Farmington, is progressing and this new facility will be opened during the summer."

B'ham Firm Changes Name

Berry Industries, Inc. was designated as the new name for the former Berry Door Corp. of Birmingham, at the firm's annual stockholder's meeting.

The change of corporate name and accompanying amendments to the Articles of Incorporation, were made for the purpose of more accurately reflecting the present as well as proposed activities of the Co.

In line with this, the incorporation of a new subsidiary, Berry Calif. Corp., Los Angeles was also announced at the meeting. Berry California will manufacture and distribute a complete line of pneumatic tools of new and advanced design.

"This promises to be a field of enormous potential, our participation should add substantially to our profit margins as well as broadening our base," reported Glenn Berry, president.

"1961 proved to be a year of breakthrough," he continued. "We began producing an electronic garage door operator which we feel has many unique characteristics and which within a few months has become one of the largest selling items of its kind. We feel the company is in a dominant position to participate in what can be the first new household appliance market of major magnitude since the garbage disposal."

The firm was a pioneer in the manufacture and merchandising of metal garage doors prior to introducing the radio controlled garage door opener and announcing the new subsidiary. Today it is recognized as one of the world's leading manufacturers of metal residential garage doors. It also entered the wood garage door market in 1961 in order to provide distributors with the broadest product line available.

At \$5,828,273, sales for 1961 were up about \$856,000 over 1960, due largely to the introduction of the operator during the latter part of the year. Berry added, "Sales for 1962 are estimated at close to \$7,000,000 not including Berry Calif. or other new product lines. With earnings in the neighborhood of \$1 per share on the 340,000 shares presently outstanding."

An initial public issue of stock in Berry Industries, Inc. was offered in Feb., 1962.

Former Lathrup Man Named by Burroughs

Bruce M. Sheffer has been named manager of Burroughs Corp.'s factory in Sao Paulo, Brazil. Ray W. Macdonald, vice-president and general manager, Burroughs International division, announced.

Sheffer, who was formerly manager of International Production Corp., replaces Sterling E. Brown, who returns to the International Home Office in Detroit as manufacturing manager for the Latin American Area.

Sheffer, his wife and three children lived at 18770 Glenwood, Lathrup Village, before moving to Brazil.

In his new capacity, Sheffer will be managing one of five factories which Burroughs maintains overseas. The others are located in Cumberland and Strathleven, Scotland, and in Villers-Ecalles and Pantin, France.

The Sao Paulo factory is operated by Burroughs do Brasil, S.A., one of the corporation's wholly-owned subsidiaries.
