Jastrzembski, the hurdler, has tallied 28 points; Moore, who specializes in the shot put and high jump, 24 1/2 points; and Mason, a freshman quarter-mile, 14.

Who knows Brother Rice could become a big prep power. Its future is in the hands of Maloney. He feels time will tell how the Warriors can eventually go in sports.

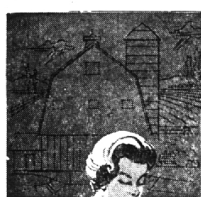

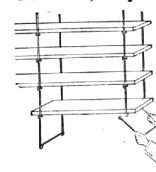

## Fingerprint Likeness

Q. Is it true that no two fingerprints are ever alike?

A. The probability of two persons having identical fingerprints is estimated mathematically to be about 1 in 64 billion. The modern use of dermatoglyphics (fingerprinting) is credited to Mark Twain who introduced the subject in "Life on the Mississippi" and "Pudd'n' Head Wilson." However, man's awareness of the patterned ridges on his fingers and palms goes back thousands of years. The most famous of ancient fingerprint designs are carvings on the walls of Neolithic burial passages located on an island off Brittany. Chinese documents of about 800 A.D. refer to fingerprints being impressed upon business contracts, divorce papers and contracts dealing with the sale of children.
