that when appointment was held in the States, the delegates were wanted to include all the slaves in their population figures; this was settled when the States were allowed to count only one-fifth of the slave population along with the whites as the basis for Congressional representation.

Desperately necessary as was the merging of the various colonial States into a united States, the delegates who were sent to the Convention existed—and men of the caliber of Patrick Henry, Samuel Adams and others of their thought, sought to do more than to set up a new class to exert too much financial influence on the delegates.

IN THOSE EARLY DAYS the combined public debt of the Confederation of States was only 4 million dollars—compared with the present day debt of the United States of nearly a half billion . . . and the U. S. debt about 300 billion!

In the end, the U. S. Constitution was adopted. Similarly, it is expected that Michigan's new Constitution will follow the pattern of human progress in the large areas of all government? . . . But not the rules of the majority rule. The delegates to the State assemblies, in decisions arrived at in Federal and State supreme courts.

While admittedly the Constitutional Convention proceedings were in Lansing, to be concluded in Philadelphia, it is not to be understood, pending, colossal, or gigantic spectacle," it nevertheless is performance of an invaluable and necessary task. It is not to be expected for an hour or two could do something of more than ordinary remembrance.

WHEN ADOPSED by the Convention delegates, it then goes to the people . . . and you are one of the people. The public discussion of the document will be allowed. Let us all hope that the final result of the delegates' deliberations will be the majority approval at the polls.

If it isn't, then 16 years must wait for the next opportunity to improve the most important and powerful civil document: an acceptable State Constitution.
