Roeper Summer Camp Offers Talent Training

The Roeper Summer Day Camp introduces a talent development program with "special interest groups" as an auxiliary to the regular camp program this year.

After the children, between the ages of 8-11, qualify upon an interview with camp director, George Roeper, and with recommendation of their teachers, they can participate in the science and dance Special Interest periods in addition to the regular camp program.

PROVISIONS have been made for about 20 of those inclined towards scientific knowledge to use the newly equipped \$12,000 laboratory for experiments under the guidance of a university faculty member.

Miss Norma Carter, professional dance teacher, will head the group with ability and talent to dance. At the end of each of two four-week periods, campers will be issued certificates of distinction, if they have worked hard on a non-competitive basis.

Special interest campers must be enrolled in the regular camp program, but will have 90 minutes a day to concentrate on their chosen interest.

The Roeper Day Camp has operated on the 11-acre premises of the City and Country School of Bloomfield Hills since 1957.

THE CAMP season lasts eight

weeks, starting June 25 to August 17.

All the counselors are licensed teachers and the counselor-child ratio is 8 to 1 at the nursery and kindergarten level; 10 to 1 for 6-11-year-old groups. The Roeper believes camp leaders should be of the same caliber as faculty in a school must be.

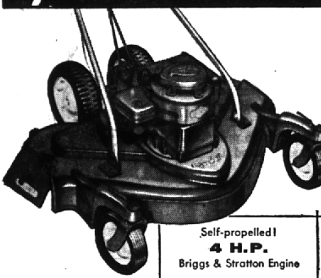
