Daughters To Model at Mom's Party

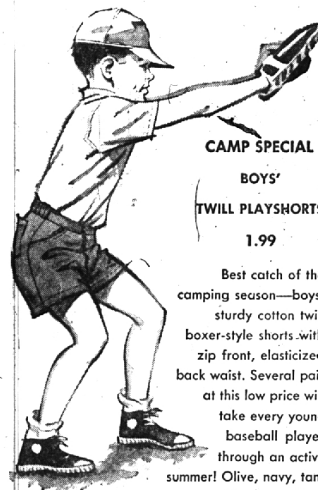
