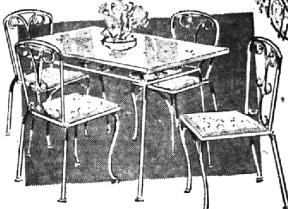

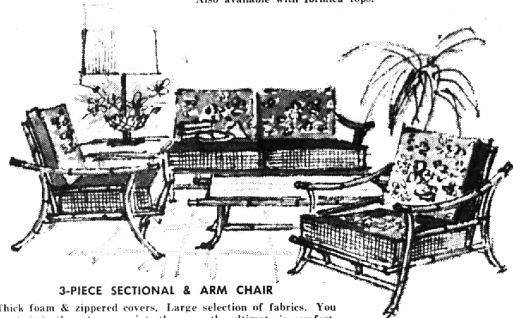

North and South are vulnerable.
