City Names Board Choices

Two appointments were made by the Birmingham City Commission at Monday night's meeting. Glenn Coley, 71, was named to the Zoning Board of Appeals, and Commissioner Robert Page, 41, was appointed to the Taxicab Board.

Coley, 1179 Yorkshire, Birmingham, replaced Mr. Charles Lewis on the Zoning Appeal Board. Lewis resigned because of "personal affairs," according to City Clerk Irene Hanley. Coley's term expires Oct. 10, 1963.

Retired six years ago, Coley was a Detroit Edison Co. engineer for 28 years. This is his first appoint-

ment to a Birmingham government post.

The six-member Zoning Board of Appeals' duties are to hear appellate appeals and pass them on with a recommendation, to the Building Inspector.

PAGE, 2468 Manchester, Birmingham, replaces Mayor Florence H. Willett on the four-member Taxicab Board. His term will extend from Monday's date until July 1, 1963.

Page was appointed to serve a vacancy on the City Commission Sept. 16, 1960, after serving seven straight years on the Planning Board. He was elected to a full term as commissioner in 1961.

A Manufacturing Supervisor at Ford Motor Co., Page will pass judgment on city taxicab problems, such as failure to meet mechanical standards, in his new job.
