


Bits of Birmingham

Sacred Heart Writers Have Works Published

"Words," a poem by Katherine Mahony; "A Song of the Sea," a poem by Rosemary Dempsey; and "Hills," an essay by Josephine DeLorenzo have been published in the 1962 edition of "Young Horizons." These three contributors are students at the Academy of the Sacred Heart in Bloomfield Hills.

This 72-page anthology of prose and poetry by Michigan and Ohio high school students is edited and published annually by the Women's Press Club of the University of Detroit.

Walls

"Walls are barriers which enclose, define and separate. They may be tangible structures of concrete and steel; or intangible, but none the less real, barriers in the mind of man. Walls may represent security and love or they may be symbols of suspicion and hatred. The significance of a wall differs according to the individual."

"To the prisoner, the grim, foreboding prison wall is the cursed symbol of his lost freedom. Walls which envelop him are constant reminders of his degradation, and as such, are despised. Yet how very different is a child's outlook. For within the familiar walls of his home the child finds security and peace. To a child, the walls which enclose him are concrete symbols of the invisible surroundings of his parent's love. The monk will see in the monastery walls a means of obtaining solitude for the contemplation of his Creator. To him, walls signify freedom from the world's distractions. To each individual the physical reality of a wall represents a different idea."

MEN CAN BUILD intangible barriers in their minds as firmly entrenched as walls of stone and steel. These are the barriers of prejudice. Behind them, a man attempts to defend his own biased opinion while allowing no calm reasoned argument to surmount these mental walls. He builds the wall as a defensive measure to hide his own ignorance and fear. He will hold to his slanted opinions about race or creed, and retire behind the barrier of prejudice if reason or truth would dispel his false ideas. Barriers in men's minds, in the form of prejudice, are often more difficult to destroy than walls of brick and mortar.

"Walls which separate men today are both tangible and intangible. The wall in Berlin is the most tangible sign of all the differences and prejudices which breed hate and suspicion among the people of the world. Particularly, it emphasizes the basic clash between those who wish to enslave—the Communists, and those who wish to free. Walls such as this, and the separation they impose, bring neither love nor trust but only hatred and fear. This is the type of wall man must work to destroy."

Some walls can bring peace and security to the individuals they enclose. Yet other walls, barriers of prejudice, only breed distrust. Walls which separate men and are the expressions of difference and hatred bring no peace and security. To break down barriers of prejudice, walls of differences, and to settle disputes honorably among nations is the challenging task we face today."
