

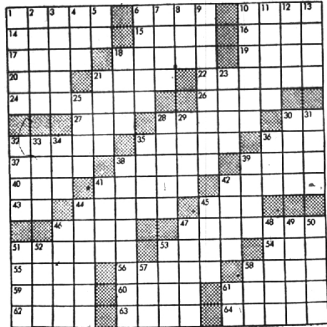

Sally Dow, instructor at the Birmingham Conservatory of Music, will team with Norman Gifford in a duo piano concert at 8:30 p.m. The program will consist of five numbers before the intermission and three following. After training in the United States, under Edward Fredholm, at 2310 Ardmore, Royal Oak, Miss Dow went to Europe for six years' study at the Conservatoire de Paris and the Salzburg Mozart-Gymnasium. In 1953 she made her Paris debut and subsequently presented for Paris music critics a premiere of atonal works by Argentine composers. 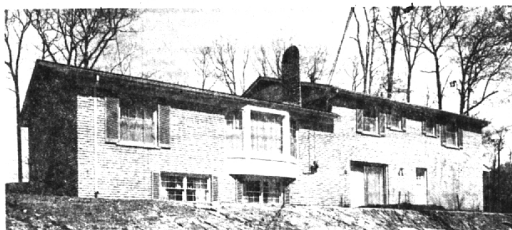

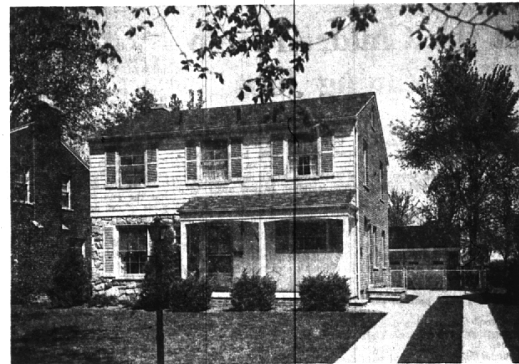

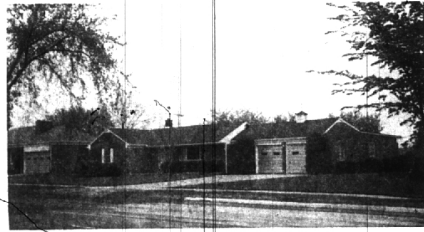
