pieces of the famous Natzler pottery. Working together for 23 years, Gertrud and Otto Natzler have acquired almost unmatched skill in the delicate shaping of pottery and the coloring of the glazes.

Several of the pieces are examples of what is called the 100th reduction firing. This is a third firing of a finished object. If successful, it causes a final intermingling of the colors in the glaze. This gives to each pot a muted, smoky cast with the same subtlety of color as seen in painting.

The exhibit is open to the public 9 a.m.-5 p.m. daily, except Sundays and Mondays, and will continue through June 9.

HERE'S SOMETHING that sounds like fun. The Franklin Village Band is recruiting musicians for their 23-member band. All you have to do is know how to read music and want to "blow your brains out" every Monday night, starting at 8:30 p.m. at the Franklin Community Church.

This is the band's third season. In addition to outdoor summer concerts, on the Village Green in Franklin (doesn't that sound pleasant?), the band has tentative plans for a performance at Tiger Stadium on Al Kaline night. Call Bill Ellison, MA 6-2386, for information.

MRS. J. VINTON Birch and **Mrs. Kent McIntyre** are two Birmingham artists represented in an important invitational exhibit at the Women's City Club of Detroit. All of the nine artists invited are showing paintings which have won prizes in 1961.

Kathleen Birch is represented by "Let There Be Firmament"—which was awarded first prize in oils at the annual show of the Detroit Society of Women Painters, at the Scarab Club. Jane McIntyre is exhibiting "Under the Bridge"—first prize winner in oils at the annual show of the Palette and Brush Club.

THE FOURTH ANNUAL exhibit of student art work from all the schools and all grades in the Birmingham school district will be one of the highlights of Michigan week.

Work will be displayed at Derby Junior High School May 25, 7-10 p.m. and May 26, 27 from 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Weather permitting, the show will be held in the open court; weather not permitting, in the indoor circular corridor.

The Birmingham Community House is also exhibiting student (children and adult) art work, in connection with Michigan week. Paintings, silver enameling, millinery, sewing, home accessories, flower arrangements and ceramics will be displayed throughout the downstairs Friday, May 25.

INTERESTINGLY enough, the city's gift to Mayor Cavanaugh on Mayor Exchange day (the first day of Michigan week) will be, for the first time, of an artistic nature—probably a painting. Albert de Salis, a vice president of the Bloomfield Art Association, is in charge of the selection.

ANOTHER EXHIBIT of student art work will be held at Bloomfield Country Day School's Strawberry Festival, May 19. All media handled during the year—from wooden plaques to sand casting—decorated objects to oil paintings, will be displayed.

Art instructor Dorothy Siddall, a prominent local painter with two paintings in the current exhibit of Michigan artists at the BAA, is arranging the booth with the help of students Nancy Booth, Debbie Wilson, Karen Boyd and Diane Larson.

I WOULD HAVE LIKED to have been along the day a group from the Birmingham Society of Women Painters visited the Barnes Museum in Merion, Pennsylvania.

Located on the estate of the late Albert C. Barnes, the museum contains one of the finest collections of Impressionistic art in the world. Dr. Barnes roamed about Europe buying

literally hundreds and hundreds of Impressionistic paintings, way before it had become fashionable.

His first show in this country was panned by the critics. He retaliated by closing the museum. It was only after his death that a long law suit was won to open the museum to the public.

IN ADDITION TO THE paintings which include Picassos, Braques, Cezannes, and Modiglianis, the collection contains African sculpture. Hanging on the wall amidst the paintings are hundreds-of-years-old works of handicraft—caskets, door hinges, keys, and locks. It was Dr. Barnes feeling that these represented as much creativity as painting and deserved the same importance.

According to members who took the trip, this was a fascinating and unique experience which they are hoping to repeat.


