Local Fencer's Bid Thwarted

Many people view fencing as a sissy sport to be enjoyed primarily by the wealthy.

BUT AFTER careful examination a person realizes that encing is a strenuous and demanding sport. It requires quick hand, agility, fast footwork, keen eye and steady

The fencer must provide perfect form at all times. Fencing exercises the body not in one place only, but in every muscle, nerve, and tendon from held to bead. It is to eye, or finger, though the bead to wrist, or eye, or finger, though the bead to be must be most important but it must be most mistaken to the head, a bracing action to the shoulders, and a full com-mand of balance to limbs and body.

THROUGHOUT Michigan fencing has drawn little, if any, attention or spectator response. But last Saturday, more than 250 filed their way into the Bloomfield list High gym to watch the State Fencing championships. James Campoli, 523 Wadsworth Lane, attempted to become the first state fencer to win three divisional titles

for the second time. He accomplished the feat in 1955. The previous triple winner was Byron Krieger. Campoli's bid for the triple crown was thwarded, owever. After he had gone through countless bouts in the foil, epec and sabre he managed successfully to defend the latter crown for the second straight year and fourth time since 1955.

The 36-year-old fencer put on a sterling uphill exhibition to force a fence-off for the sabre honors. He displayed quick footwork to defeat Bill Goering, defending Midwest sabre champion and 1964 Olympic hopeful, 5-4.

IN THE FENCE-OFF Campoli downed his opponent, 5-3, to salvage one championship. He finished second to Michael Bruce in the epee and fourth in the foil com-

petition.

In the foil, Krieger won the crown with a perfect 3-0 bout record, Conrad Gnieweck was runner-up and Sandy Weinstine third.


