## Village of Beverly Hills

### ORDINANCE NO. 56

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 29 ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING AND RESTRICTING THE HEIGHT, NUMBER OF STORIES AND SIZE OF BUILDINGS; THE SIZE OF OPEN SPACES; THE DENSITY OF POPULATION; THE LOCATION AND USE OF BUILDINGS AND LAND FOR TRADE, RESIDENCE AND OTHER PURPOSES; CREATING DISTRICTS FOR SAID PURPOSES AND ESTABLISHING THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR CHANGES IN REGULATIONS, RESTRICTIONS, AND BOUNDARIES OF SUCH DISTRICTS; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS USED HEREIN; PROVIDING FOR ENFORCEMENT; ESTABLISHMENT OF A ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS; AND IMPOSING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE."

The Village of Beverly Hills Ordains:

Section 1.01. That Ordinance No. 29 entitled "An Ordinance Regulating and Restricting the Height, Number of Stories and Size of Buildings; The Location and Use of Buildings and Land for Trade, Residence and Other Purposes; Creating Districts for Said Purposes and Establishing the Boundaries Thereof; Providing for Changes in Regulations and Boundaries of Such Districts; Defining Certain Terms Used Herein; Providing for Enforcement; Establishment of a Zoning Board of Appeals; and Imposing Penalties for the Violation of this Ordinance" be and the same hereby is amended by amending the Zone Map attached thereto and made a part thereof as follows:

A. That the following described property is changed from Single Family Residential 1 (R-1) zone use to Parking (P) zone use:

1. The West 130 feet of the North 291 feet of Lot 13, Crystal Springs Subdivision.

Section 2.01. Public hearing having been held hereon May 7, 1962, and the statutory notices having been published and mailed, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be immediately necessary for the preservation of public peace, health and safety and hereby ordered to take effect immediately upon publication.

Made and passed by the Village Council of the Village of Beverly Hills, on the 7th day of May, 1962.

## Prisoners Help Solve Road Building Problems

Inside Southern Michigan Prison here are 18 prisoners who are doing some of the key work in Michigan's highway building program.

What these men do is think—think of ways to program the electronic computers that solve many of the complex problems of highway design.

Programming is the technique of giving instructions to computers in language that machines can understand.

COMPUTERS HAVE BECOME famous for their ability to process mountains of statistical data or to give split-second answers to complicated problems. But despite their nicknames, computers aren't electronic "brains". They can't think for themselves. Every move they make must be spelled out for them in specific detail.

Take a simple arithmetic problem, like adding 3 and 2. The programmer would have to tell the computer something like this:

"Store in your memory, at location 00078, is a piece of information. Take the information from 00078 and put it in the accumulator."

"Now take the information from location 00031 and put it in the accumulator."

"Now take the contents of the accumulator and print it on the paper tape."

Computers can't understand this kind of talk, so the programmer has to convert it to computer language, which may be punched cards or tape or magnetic tape. Only then would the machine be able to stamp out "5".

Computers are seldom bothered with simple arithmetic. In highway work, they're more likely to be analyzing traffic counts or designing bridges. These present the logical problems that only they occupy a human engineer for months. The computers can kick out the answers in a few seconds.

## Board Requests Increase in Funds For State Library

Consisting of five members appointed for five year terms by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate, the Michigan State Board for Libraries is responsible for the development, extension, improvement and coordination of library service throughout Michigan.

Chairman is Stephen C. Andrews, director of the Fiscal Agent department in Lansing. He succeeded the late Harvey L. Sherwood, of Kalamazoo, in December.

Vice-chairman is Mrs. Mary Daume, librarian of the Monroe county library in Monroe. Other members are Dr. G. Flint Purdy, librarian, Wayne State university library, and Mrs. Dorothy S. McAllister, Grand Rapids. The vacancy caused by Mr. Sherwood's death is still unfilled.

The Board has asked the Legislature for 24 million dollars to operate the State Library system in 1962-63, compared to the \$1 million current appropriation. The request includes \$522,000 for the State Library, Law Library, State Library for the Blind and the Upper Peninsula branch at Escanaba. It also includes for support of the State Library's microfilm program and building a legislative reference service.

And most of the men feel the computer programming will give them a hold on the outside world that will keep them from ever returning to prison.

One of the prisoners said:

"I think I've found my life's work—I know what I'm going to be looking for when I get on the outside."

And the prospects seem to be good for these programing experts. One estimate has it that there are 25,000 openings for programmers throughout the country.

The programers at Jackson work under the joint supervision of the State Department of Corrections and the State Highway Department. The prisoners' supervisor is Dewey Flaughter, a computer expert for the Highway Department.

Electronic computers may help to measure management according to extension poultryman Floyd Hicks.

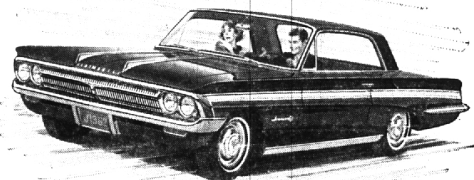
Hicks reports the MSU poultry department has developed a new record plan called the Michigan Poultry Performance Program.

This program will analyze complete flock performances for all poultry producers enrolled, says Hicks.

A SPECIFIC GOAL which all co-operators should strive to reach includes 250 eggs per hen housed.

Other goals for success are a feed conversion of four pounds per dozen eggs produced, mortality of less than 10 per cent, total production costs less than 27 cents per dozen, less than three per cent cracked eggs and over 95 per cent grade A eggs sold.

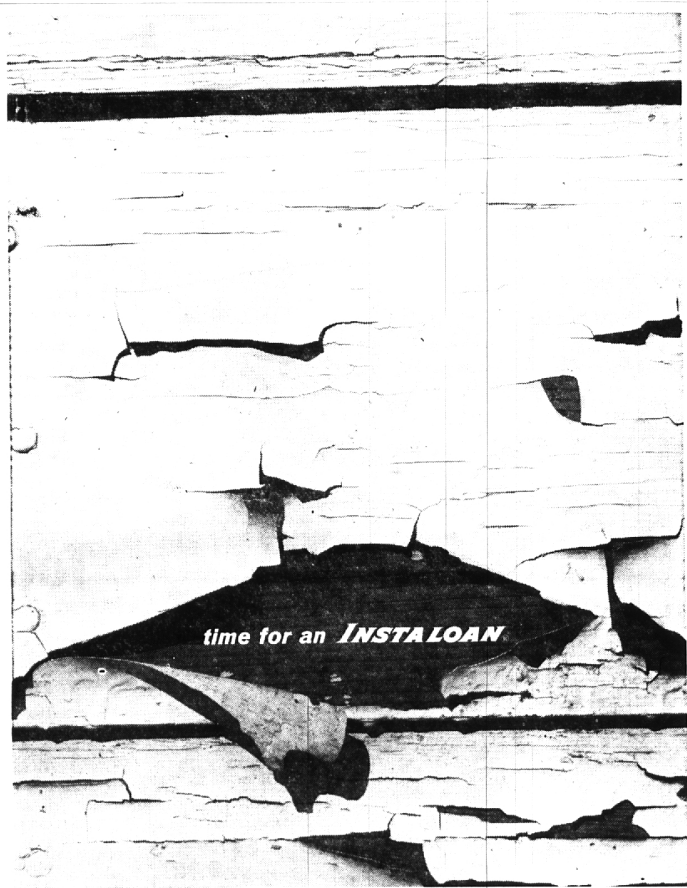
