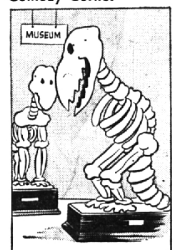
The trails have been developed through the efforts of the Royal Oak garden group, assisted by the scouts in the area.

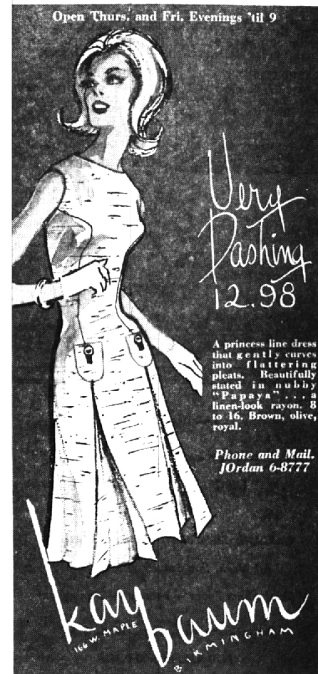

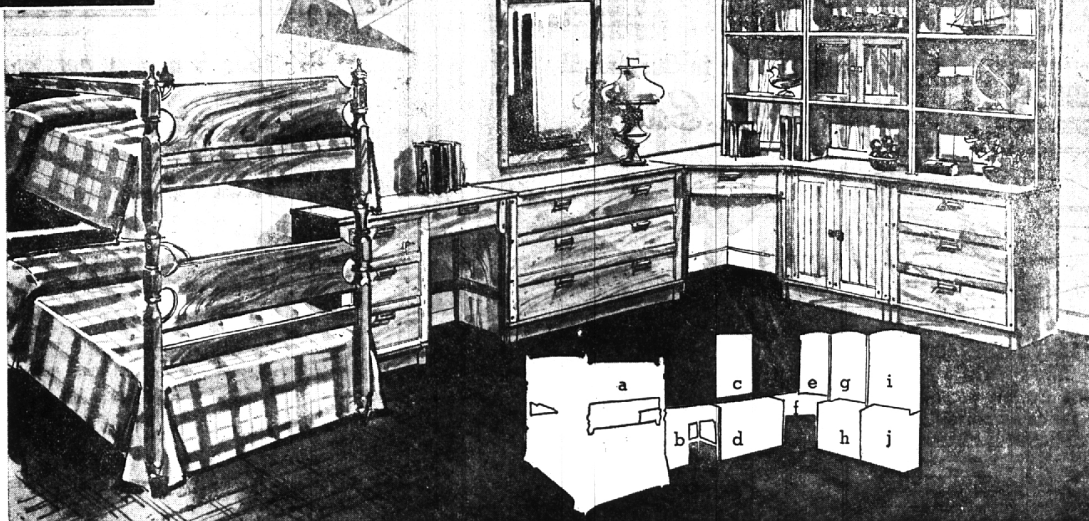
