Mrs. Bohner spent six months enjoying many visits from local families and Mr. Bohner joined his wife for a month of relaxation.

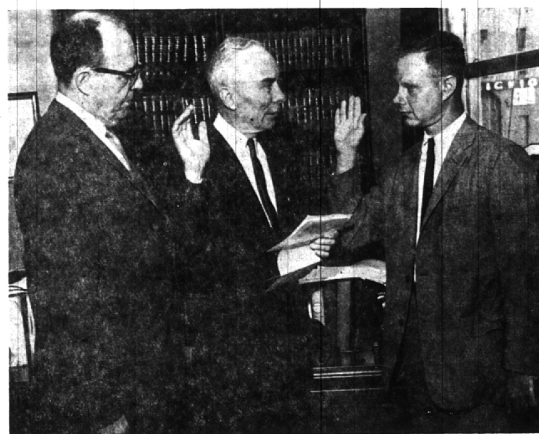
## DELLS OF BLOOMFIELD

Organized last fall to actively

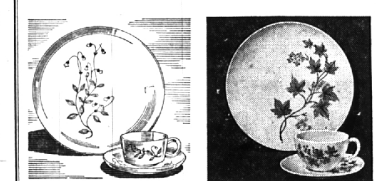
