


War in mind, but the moods of armies do not seem to change.

Win Gold Medal Award

They wanted to build a better mousetrap!

And as a result, 26 years after starting business in a home basement, Carl Sundberg and Montgomery Ferrar, Southfield appliance architect partners, received the Gold Medal award for "superiority in developing outstanding designs" last Tuesday in Dallas, Texas.

The presentation was made at the American Institute of Architects national convention by AIA President Philip Will, Jr.

Sundberg-Ferrar Designers was called "the largest independent appliance design firm in the world" by Will.

STENBERG, OF 320 Martell, Bloomfield Hills, uses an optimistic philosophy business. "Shoppers will invariably choose the better designed product," he says. "Our motto is 'Design is the articulation of quality'."

The two men started 26 years ago in their home basement workshop, and have expanded six times since then. Their company creates new designs for appliances in the fields of consumer, industrial and architectural products. They also design factories, office buildings, retain stores, private residences and churches.

Other awards presented to the two designers were won in 1959 for the IBM computer; Sperry-Rand marine navigational equipment; and 1961, Tower Capri type-writer.
